Ms. SNOWE (for herself and Mr. MACK) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To authorize the Administrator of General Services to permit the posting in space under the control of the Administrator of notices concerning missing children, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. POSTING IN FEDERAL BUILDINGS OF NOTICES**

4 **CONCERNING MISSING CHILDREN.**

5 The Act of June 1, 1948 (62 Stat. 281, chapter 359;
6 40 U.S.C. 318 et seq.), is amended by adding at the end
7 the following:

1 **“SEC. 6. POSTING OF NOTICES CONCERNING MISSING CHIL-**
2 **DREN.**

3 “(a) IN GENERAL.—The Administrator of General
4 Services (referred to in this section as the ‘Administrator’)
5 shall issue regulations to permit the posting in space
6 under the control of the Administrator of materials, such
7 as pamphlets, handbills, and flyers, concerning missing
8 children.

9 “(b) MARK INDICATING AUTHORIZATION.—Regula-
10 tions issued under subsection (a) shall include the require-
11 ment that any such posted material bear an official identi-
12 fying mark indicating that the Administrator authorizes
13 the posting of the material.

14 “(c) RECIPROCIDY.—An officer or employee of an
15 agency of the Federal Government may not remove any
16 posted material bearing an official identifying mark de-
17 scribed in subsection (b) except in accordance with regula-
18 tions issued under subsection (a).”.
