Mr. BUMPERS introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

## A BILL

To require the Secretary of the Interior to convey the Corning National Fish Hatchery to the State of Arkansas.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Corning National Fish  
5 Hatchery Conveyance Act of 1995”.

6 **SEC. 2. CONVEYANCE OF THE CORNING NATIONAL FISH**  
7 **HATCHERY TO THE STATE OF ARKANSAS.**

8 (a) CONVEYANCE REQUIREMENT.—The Secretary of  
9 the Interior shall convey to the State of Arkansas, without  
10 reimbursement and by no later than December 31, 1995,

1 all right, title, and interest of the United States in and  
2 to the property described in subsection (b), for use by the  
3 Arkansas Game and Fish Commission as part of the State  
4 of Arkansas fish culture program.

5 (b) PROPERTY DESCRIBED.—The property referred  
6 to in subsection (a) is the property formally known as the  
7 Corning National Fish Hatchery, (popularly known as the  
8 William H. Donham State Fish Hatchery), located one  
9 mile west of Corning, Arkansas, on Arkansas State High-  
10 way 67 in Clay County, Arkansas, consisting of 137.34  
11 acres, (more or less) and all improvements and related  
12 personal property under the control of the Secretary that  
13 is located on that property, including buildings, structures,  
14 and equipment.

15 (c) REVERSIONARY INTEREST OF UNITED STATES.—  
16 All right, title, and interest in property described in sub-  
17 section (b) shall revert to the United States if the property  
18 ceases to be used as part of the State of Arkansas fish  
19 culture program. The State of Arkansas shall ensure that  
20 the property reverting to the United States is in substan-  
21 tially the same or better condition as the time of the trans-  
22 fer.
