A BILL

To eliminate taxpayer subsidies for recreational shooting programs, and to prevent the transfer of federally-owned weapons, ammunition, funds, and other property to a private Corporation for the Promotion of Rifle Practice and Firearms Safety.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Self Financing Civilian
5 Marksmanship Program Act of 1996”.

1 **SEC. 2. PRIVATE SHOOTING COMPETITIONS AND FIREARM**
2 **SAFETY PROGRAMS.**

3 Nothing in this Act prohibits any private person from
4 establishing a privately financed program to support
5 shooting competitions or firearms safety programs.

6 **SEC. 3. REPEAL OF CHARTER LAW FOR THE CORPORATION**
7 **FOR THE PROMOTION OF RIFLE PRACTICE**
8 **AND SAFETY.**

9 (a) REPEAL OF CHARTER.—The Corporation for the
10 Promotion of Rifle Practice and Firearms Safety Act (title
11 XVI of Public Law 104–106; 110 Stat. 515; 36 U.S.C.
12 5501 et seq.), except for section 1624 of such Act (110
13 Stat. 522), is repealed.

14 (b) RELATED REPEALS.—Section 1624 of such Act
15 (110 Stat. 522) is amended—

16 (1) in paragraphs (1) and (2) of subsection (a),
17 by striking out “and 4311” and inserting in lieu
18 thereof “4311, 4312, and 4313”;

19 (2) by striking out subsection (b); and

20 (3) in subsection (c), by striking out “on the
21 earlier of—” and all that follows and inserting in
22 lieu thereof “on October 1, 1996.”.

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
