- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as "Alu-O'Hara Public Safety
- 5 Officers Health Benefits Act".

1 SEC. 2. PROTECTION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS.

- 2 Part L of title I of the Omnibus Crime Control and
- 3 Safe Streets Act of 1968 is amended by adding at the
- 4 end the following:

5 "SEC. 1204A. PROTECTION FOR PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS.

- 6 "A grant made under part Q of this title that would
- 7 otherwise be made available to a State shall be reduced
- 8 by 10 percent unless a public safety officer who is sepa-
- 9 rated from service due to an injury suffered as the direct
- 10 and proximate result of a personal injury sustained in the
- 11 line of duty (during an emergency situation, or a hot pur-
- 12 suit as such terms are defined by State law) continues
- 13 after such injury to receive the same or better level of
- 14 health insurance benefits that are paid at the time of sepa-
- 15 ration by the State or unit of local government within the
- 16 State that employed such officer.".

17 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE.

- The amendment made by this Act shall take effect
- 19 beginning on October 1 of the first fiscal year beginning
- 20 after the last day of the 2-year period beginning on the
- 21 date on the enactment of this Act.
