**A BILL**

To designate additional land as within the Chaco Culture Archeological Protection Sites, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2       *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3       **SECTION. 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Chacoan Outliers  
5       Protection Act of 1995”.

1 **SEC. 2. PURPOSES.**

2 Section 501(b) of Public Law 96-550 (16 U.S.C.  
3 410ii(b)) is amended by striking “San Juan Basin;” and  
4 inserting “San Juan Basin and surrounding areas;”.

5 **SEC. 3. ADDITIONS TO CHACO CULTURE ARCHEOLOGICAL**  
6 **PROTECTION SITES.**

7 Subsection 502(b) of Public Law 96-550 (16 U.S.C.  
8 410ii-1(b)) is amended to read as follows:

9 “(b)(1) Thirty-nine outlying sites as generally de-  
10 picted on a map entitled ‘Chaco Culture Archeological  
11 Protection Sites’, numbered 310/80,033-B and dated Sep-  
12 tember 1991, are designated as ‘Chaco Culture Archeolog-  
13 ical Protection Sites’. The 39 archeological protection sites  
14 totaling approximately 14,372 acres are identified as  
15 follows:

1       “(2) The map referred to in paragraph (1) shall be—

2               “(A) kept on file and available for public in-

3       spection in—

4               “(i) appropriate offices of the National

5       Park Service;

6               “(ii) the office of the State Director of the

7       Bureau of Land Management in Santa Fe, New

8       Mexico; and

9               “(iii) the office of the Area Director of the

10       Bureau of Indian Affairs in Window Rock, Ari-

11       zona; and

12       “(B) made available for the purposes described

13       in subparagraph (A) to the offices of the Arizona

14       and New Mexico State Historic Preservation Offi-

15       cers.”.

1 **SEC. 4. DEFINITION.**

2 Section 503 of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C. 410ii–  
3 2) is amended by inserting “(referred to in this title as  
4 the ‘Secretary’)” after “Secretary of the Interior”.

5 **SEC. 5. LAND ACQUISITIONS.**

6 Section 504(c)(2) of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C.  
7 410ii–3(c)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

8 “(2) The Secretary shall seek to use a combination  
9 of land acquisition authority under this section and coop-  
10 erative agreements under section 505 to protect archeolog-  
11 ical resources at such sites described in section 502(b) as  
12 remain in private ownership.”.

13 **SEC. 6. ASSISTANCE TO THE NAVAJO NATION.**

14 Section 506 of Public Law 96–550 (16 U.S.C. 410ii–  
15 5) is amended by adding at the end the following new sub-  
16 section:

17 “(f)(1) The Secretary, acting through the Director of  
18 the National Park Service, shall assist the Navajo Nation  
19 in the protection and management of such Chaco Culture  
20 Archeological Protection Sites as are located on lands  
21 under the jurisdiction of the Navajo Nation through a  
22 grant, contract, or cooperative agreement entered into  
23 under the Indian Self-Determination and Education As-  
24 sistance Act (25 U.S.C. 450 et seq.).

25 “(2) The assistance provided under paragraph (1)  
26 shall—

1           “(A) consist of assistance in site planning, re-  
2           source protection, interpretation, resource manage-  
3           ment actions, and such other activities as may be  
4           identified in the grant, contract, or cooperative  
5           agreement; and

6           “(B) include assistance with the development of  
7           a Navajo facility to serve persons who seek to appre-  
8           ciate the Chacoan Outlier Sites.”.
