## A BILL

To authorize the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity to establish a memorial to Martin Luther King, Jr., in the District of Columbia, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR., MEMORIAL.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—

5 (1) ESTABLISHMENT.—Subject to subsection  
6 (b), the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity is authorized to  
7 establish a memorial to Martin Luther King, Jr., in  
8 the District of Columbia and its environs in accord-  
9 ance with the Act entitled “An Act to provide stand-

1 ards for placement of commemorative works on cer-  
2 tain Federal lands in the District of Columbia and  
3 its environs, and for other purposes”, approved  
4 November 14, 1986 (40 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.), to  
5 honor Martin Luther King, Jr.

6 (2) DEFINITION.—For purposes of paragraph  
7 (1), the term “the District of Columbia and its envi-  
8 rons” has the same meaning given to the term by  
9 section 2(e) of the Act (40 U.S.C. 1002(e)).

10 (b) NO EXPENSE TO THE UNITED STATES.—The  
11 United States shall not pay any of the expenses of estab-  
12 lishing the memorial under subsection (a).
