Mr. FEINGOLD introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

A BILL

To phase out Federal funding of the Tennessee Valley Authority.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. TENNESSEE VALLEY AUTHORITY.**

4 (a) DISCONTINUANCE OF APPROPRIATIONS.—Section
5 27 of the Tennessee Valley Authority Act of 1933 (16
6 U.S.C. 831z) is amended—

7 (1) by inserting “for fiscal years ending with
8 (and including) fiscal year 1996” before the period;
9 and

10 (2) by adding at the end the following: “No ap-
11 propriations may be made available for the National

1 Fertilizer and Environmental Research Center for
2 fiscal year 1996.”.

3 (b) REPORT.—Not later than January 1, 1996, the
4 Director of the Office of Management and Budget shall
5 submit a plan to Congress that—

6 (1) describes the programs that should continue
7 to be operated by the Tennessee Valley Authority
8 after fiscal year 1996 and describes how those pro-
9 grams should be funded;

10 (2) describes the programs that the Tennessee
11 Valley Authority should discontinue or should trans-
12 fer to other entities after fiscal year 1996; and

13 (3) recommends any legislation that may be
14 necessary or appropriate to carry out the purposes
15 of this Act.

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
