Mr. GRASSLEY introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

For the relief of Foad Miahi-Neysi and his wife, Haiedeh Miahi-Neysi.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. PERMANENT RESIDENCE.**

4 Notwithstanding any provision of the Immigration
5 and Nationality Act, for the purposes of such Act, Foad
6 Miahi-Neysi and his wife, Haiedeh Miahi-Neysi, shall be
7 held and considered to have been lawfully admitted to the
8 United States for permanent residence as of the date of
9 the enactment of this Act, upon payment of the required
10 visa fees.

1 **SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF THE NUMBER OF AVAILABLE VISAS.**

2 Upon the granting of permanent residence to the in-
3 dividuals named in section 1, the Secretary of State shall
4 instruct the proper officer to reduce by the proper number,
5 during the current or the next fiscal year—

6 (1) the total number of immigrant visas avail-
7 able to natives of the country of the aliens' birth
8 under section 203(a) of the Immigration and Na-
9 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1153(a)); or

10 (2) if applicable, the total number of immigrant
11 visas available to natives of the country of the aliens'
12 birth under section 202(e) of the Act (8 U.S.C.
13 1152(e)).
