To amend title 23, United States Code, to eliminate the national maximum speed limit, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. REPEAL OF NATIONAL MAXIMUM SPEED LIMIT.
- 4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 154 of title 23, United
- 5 States Code, is repealed.

- 7 (1) The analysis for chapter 1 of the title is

8	pears and inserting "subsection (a)".

12	and inserting "section 141(a)".
13	(4) Section 153(i)(2) of title 23, United States
14	Code, is amended to read as follows:

17	cal power manufactured primarily for use on public
18	highways, except any vehicle operated exclusively on

9	cle' means any vehicle driven or drawn by mechani-
10	cal power manufactured primarily for use on public
11	highways, except any vehicle operated exclusively on
12	a rail or rails.".
