## A BILL

- To authorize the establishment of the National African American Museum within the Smithsonian Institution, and for other purposes.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "National African 5 American Museum Act"

5 American Museum Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS.

7 The Congress finds that—

(1) the presentation and preservation of African
 American life, art, history, and culture within the
 National Park System and other Federal entities are
 inadequate;

5 (2) the inadequate presentation and preserva-6 tion of African American life, art, history, and cul-7 ture seriously restrict the ability of the people of the 8 United States, particularly African Americans, to 9 understand themselves and their past;

10 (3) African American life, art, history, and cul-11 ture include the varied experiences of Africans in 12 slavery and freedom and the continued struggles for 13 full recognition of citizenship and treatment with 14 human dignity;

(4) in enacting Public Law 99–511, the Congress encouraged support for the establishment of a
commemorative structure within the National Park
System, or on other Federal lands, dedicated to the
promotion of understanding, knowledge, opportunity,
and equality for all people;

(5) the establishment of a national museum and
the conducting of interpretive and educational programs, dedicated to the heritage and culture of African Americans, will help to inspire and educate the
people of the United States regarding the cultural

legacy of African Americans and the contributions
 made by African Americans to the society of the
 United States; and

4 (6) the Smithsonian Institution operates 15
5 museums and galleries, a zoological park, and 5
6 major research facilities, none of which is a national
7 institution devoted solely to African American life,
8 art, history, or culture.

9 SEC. 3. ESTABLISHMENT OF THE NATIONAL AFRICAN10AMERICAN MUSEUM.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established within
the Smithsonian Institution a Museum, which shall be
known as the "National African American Museum".

14 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of the Museum is to pro-15 vide—

16 (1) a center for scholarship relating to African17 American life, art, history, and culture;

(2) a location for permanent and temporary exhibits documenting African American life, art, history, and culture;

(3) a location for the collection and study of artifacts and documents relating to African American
life, art, history, and culture;

(4) a location for public education programs re lating to African American life, art, history, and cul ture; and

4 (5) a location for training of museum profes5 sionals and others in the arts, humanities, and
6 sciences regarding museum practices related to Afri7 can American life, art, history, and culture.

# 8 SEC. 4. LOCATION AND CONSTRUCTION OF THE NATIONAL 9 AFRICAN AMERICAN MUSEUM.

10 The Board of Regents is authorized to plan, design, 11 reconstruct, and renovate the Arts and Industries Build-12 ing of the Smithsonian Institution to house the Museum.

#### 13 SEC. 5. BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF MUSEUM.

(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—There is established in the
Smithsonian Institution the Board of Trustees of the National African American Museum.

17 (b) COMPOSITION AND APPOINTMENT.—The Board18 of Trustees shall be composed of 23 members as follows:

19 (1) The Secretary of the Smithsonian Institu-20 tion.

21 (2) An Assistant Secretary of the Smithsonian22 Institution, designated by the Board of Regents.

(3) Twenty-one individuals of diverse disciplines
and geographical residence who are committed to the
advancement of knowledge of African American art,

history, and culture, appointed by the Board of Re gents, of whom 9 members shall be from among in dividuals nominated by African American museums,
 historically black colleges and universities, and cul tural or other organizations.

6 (c) TERMS.—

7 (1) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in para8 graph (2), members of the Board of Trustees shall
9 be appointed for terms of 3 years. Members of the
10 Board of Trustees may be reappointed.

11 (2) STAGGERED TERMS.—As designated by the 12 Board of Regents at the time of initial appointments 13 under paragraph (3) of subsection (b), the terms of 14 7 members shall expire at the end of 1 year, the 15 terms of 7 members shall expire at the end of 2 16 years, and the terms of 7 members shall expire at 17 the end of 3 years.

18 (d) VACANCIES.—A vacancy on the Board of Trust-19 ees shall not affect its powers and shall be filled in the 20 manner in which the original appointment was made. Any 21 member appointed to fill a vacancy occurring before the 22 expiration of the term for which the predecessor of the 23 member was appointed shall be appointed for the remain-24 der of the term. (e) NONCOMPENSATION.—Except as provided in sub section (f), members of the Board of Trustees shall serve
 without pay.

4 (f) EXPENSES.—Members of the Board of Trustees 5 shall receive per diem, travel, and transportation expenses 6 for each day, including travel time, during which such 7 members are engaged in the performance of the duties of 8 the Board of Trustees in accordance with section 5703 9 of title 5, United States Code, with respect to employees 10 serving intermittently in the Government service.

(g) CHAIRPERSON.—The Board of Trustees shall
elect a chairperson by a majority vote of the members of
the Board of Trustees.

(h) MEETINGS.—The Board of Trustees shall meet
at the call of the chairperson or upon the written request
of a majority of its members, but shall meet not less than
2 times each year.

(i) QUORUM.—A majority of the Board of Trustees
shall constitute a quorum for purposes of conducting business, but a lesser number may receive information on behalf of the Board of Trustees.

(j) VOLUNTARY SERVICES.—Notwithstanding section
1342 of title 31, United States Code, the chairperson of
the Board of Trustees may accept for the Board of Trust-

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ees voluntary services provided by a member of the Board
 of Trustees.

3 SEC. 6. DUTIES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE 4 MUSEUM.

5 The Board of Trustees shall—

6 (1) recommend annual budgets for the Mu-7 seum;

8 (2) consistent with the general policy estab-9 lished by the Board of Regents, have the sole au-10 thority to—

(A) loan, exchange, sell, or otherwise dispose of any part of the collections of the Museum, but only if the funds generated by such
disposition are used for additions to the collections of the Museum or for additions to the endowment of the Museum;

(B) subject to the availability of funds and
the provisions of annual budgets of the Museum, purchase, accept, borrow, or otherwise
acquire artifacts and other property for addition to the collections of the Museum;

(C) establish policy with respect to the utilization of the collections of the Museum; and
(D) establish policy regarding programming, education, exhibitions, and research, with

| 19 | (4) establish programs in cooperation with            |
| 20 | other African American museums, historically black    |
| 21 | colleges and universities, historical societies, edu- |
| 22 | cational institutions, and cultural and other organi- |
| 23 | zations for the education and promotion of under-     |
| 24 | standing regarding African American life, art, his-   |
| 25 | tory, and culture;                                    |

| 1  | (5) support the efforts of other African Amer-           |
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| 2  | ican museums, historically black colleges and univer-    |
| 3  | sities, and cultural and other organizations to edu-     |
| 4  | cate and promote understanding regarding African         |
| 5  | American life, art, history, and culture, including—     |
| 6  | (A) the development of cooperative pro-                  |

| 22 | SEC. 7. DIRECTOR AND STAFF.                              |
| 23 | (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of the Smithsonian         |
| 24 | Institution, in consultation with the Board of Trustees, |
| 25 | shall appoint a Director who shall manage the Museum.    |

(b) APPLICABILITY OF CERTAIN CIVIL SERVICE
 LAWS.—The Secretary of the Smithsonian Institution
 may—

4 (1) appoint the Director and 5 employees of the
5 Museum, without regard to the provisions of title 5,
6 United States Code, governing appointments in the
7 competitive service; and

8 (2) fix the pay of the Director and such 5 em-9 ployees, without regard to the provisions of chapter 10 51 and subchapter III of chapter 53 of such title, 11 relating to classification and General Schedule pay 12 rates.

#### 13 SEC. 8. DEFINITIONS.

14 For purposes of this Act:

(1) ARTS AND INDUSTRIES BUILDING.—The
term "Arts and Industries Building" means the
building located on the Mall at 900 Jefferson Drive,
S.W. in Washington, the District of Columbia.

(2) BOARD OF REGENTS.—The term "Board of
Regents" means the Board of Regents of the Smithsonian Institution.

(3) BOARD OF TRUSTEES.—The term "Board
of Trustees" means the Board of Trustees of the
National African American Museum established in
section 5(a).

(4) MUSEUM.—The term "Museum" means the
 National African American Museum established
 under section 3(a).

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
