3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Yellowstone National
- 5 Park 125th Anniversary Commemorative Coin Act".

6 SEC. 2. YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK COMMEMORATIVE
7 COIN.

8 The Secretary of the Treasury (in this Act referred 9 to as the "Secretary") shall mint and issue coins in ac-

3 SEC. 3. SPECIFICATIONS.

4 (a) 1 DOLLAR SILVER COINS.—The Secretary shall
5 mint and issue not more than 500,000 1 dollar coins, each
6 of which shall—

- 7 (1) weigh 26.73 grams;
- 8 (2) have a diameter of 1.500 inches; and

9 (3) contain 90 percent silver and 10 percent 10 copper.

(b) LEGAL TENDER.—The coins minted under this
Act shall be legal tender as provided in section 5103 of
title 31, United States Code.

14 SEC. 4. SOURCES OF BULLION.

The Secretary shall obtain silver for the coins minted under this Act from stockpiles established under the Strategic and Critical Minerals Stock Piling Act (50 U.S.C. 898 et seq.).

19 SEC. 5. DESIGN OF COINS.

20 (a) IN GENERAL.—The design of the coins minted
21 under this Act shall be emblematic of Yellowstone Na22 tional Park. On each coin, there shall be—

23 (1) a designation of the value of the coin;

- 24 (2) an inscription of the year "1997"; and
- 25 (3) inscriptions of the words—

(A) "Liberty"; 1 (B) "In God We Trust"; 2 (C) "United States of America"; and 3 (D) "E Pluribus Unum". 4 (b) SELECTION OF DESIGN.—The design of the coins 5 minted under this Act shall be— 6 7 (1) selected by the Secretary after consultation 8 with the United States Commission of Fine Arts; 9 and (2) reviewed by the Citizens Commemorative 10 Coin Advisory Committee in accordance with section 11 5134 of title 31, United States Code. 12 13 SEC. 6. ISSUANCE OF COINS. (a) PERIOD OF ISSUANCE.—The coins minted under 14 15 this Act shall be issued only during the year 1997. (b) QUALITY OF COINS.—The coins minted under 16 this Act shall be issued in uncirculated and proof qualities. 17 18 (c) MINT FACILITY.—Not more than 1 facility of the United States Mint may be used to strike any particular 19 combination of denomination and quality of coins minted 20 under this Act. 21 22 SEC. 7. SALE OF COINS. (a) SALE PRICE.—The Secretary shall sell the coins 23

24 minted under this Act at a price equal to the face value,25 plus the cost of designing, minting, and issuing the coins

1 (including labor, materials, dies, use of machinery, over2 head expenses, marketing, and shipping) and the sur3 charge provided for in subsection (d).

4 (b) BULK SALES.—The Secretary shall make bulk
5 sales of the coins minted under this Act at a reasonable
6 discount to reflect the lower costs of the sales.

7 (c) PREPAID ORDERS.—The Secretary shall accept 8 prepaid orders for the coins minted under this Act prior 9 to their issuance. Sales under this subsection shall be at 10 a reasonable discount.

11 (d) SURCHARGES.—All sales of coins minted under12 this Act shall include a surcharge of \$10 per coin.

13 SEC. 8. USE OF SURCHARGES.

14 Surcharges received from the sale of coins minted 15 under this Act shall be distributed by the Secretary as 16 follows:

(1) YELLOWSTONE NATIONAL PARK.—50 percent of the surcharges shall be paid to the Secretary
of the Interior to be used for Yellowstone National
Park, which amounts shall be in addition to any
other amounts appropriated or otherwise made available for Yellowstone National Park.

(2) NATIONAL PARK SERVICE.—50 percent of
the surcharges shall be paid to the Secretary of the

Interior for use by the National Park Service Foun dation.

3 SEC. 9. FINANCIAL ASSURANCES.

The Secretary shall take actions necessary to ensure
that the minting and issuance of coins under this Act will
not result in any net cost to the Federal Government.

7 SEC. 10. GENERAL WAIVER OF PROCUREMENT REGULA8 TIONS.

9 (a) IN GENERAL.—Except as provided in subsection 10 (b), no provision of law governing procurement or public 11 contracts shall be applicable to the procurement of goods 12 or services relating to the minting and selling of the coins 13 authorized by this Act.

(b) EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY.—Subsection (a) shall not relieve any person entering into a contract under the authority of this Act from complying with
any law relating to equal employment opportunity.

18 SEC. 11. NUMISMATIC PUBLIC ENTERPRISE FUND.

19 The coins issued under this Act are subject to the 20 provisions of section 5134 of title 31, United States Code, 21 relating to the Numismatic Public Enterprise Fund.
