Mr. DOLE submitted the following concurrent resolution; which was considered and agreed to

CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Providing for a conditional recess or adjournment of the Senate on Thursday, June 29, 1995, or Friday, June 30, 1995, until Monday, July 10, 1995, and a conditional adjournment of the House on the legislative day of Friday, June 30, 1995, until Monday, July 10, 1995.

1 *Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives*
2 *concurring)*, That when the Senate recesses or adjourns
3 at the close of business on Thursday, June 29, 1995, or
4 Friday, June 30, 1995, pursuant to a motion made by
5 the majority leader or his designee, in accordance with this
6 resolution, it stand recessed or adjourned until 12:00 noon
7 on Monday, July 10, 1995, or until such time on that day

1 as may be specified by the majority leader or his designee
2 in the motion to recess or adjourn, or until 12:00 noon
3 on the second day after Members are notified to reassem-
4 ble pursuant to section 2 of this resolution, whichever oc-
5 curs first; and that when the House of Representatives
6 adjourns on the legislative day of Friday, June 30, 1995,
7 it stand adjourned until 2:00 p.m. on Monday, July 10,
8 1995, or until 12:00 noon on the second day after Mem-
9 bers are notified to reassemble pursuant to section 2 of
10 this resolution, whichever occurs first.

11 SEC. 2. The majority leader of the Senate and the
12 Speaker of the House, acting jointly after consultation
13 with the minority leader of the Senate and the minority
14 leader of the House, shall notify the Members of the Sen-
15 ate and the House, respectively, to reassemble whenever,
16 in their opinion, the public interest shall warrant it.
