CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Restating the commitment to a seven year balanced budget

Resolved by the Senate (the House of Representatives
concurring), That:

3 (1) The President and the Congress shall enact 4 legislation in the second session of the One Hundred 5 Fourth Congress to achieve a balanced budget not 6 later than fiscal year 2002 as estimated by the Con-7 gressional Budget Office, and the President and the 8 Congress agree that the balanced budget must pro-9 tect future generations, ensure medicare solvency, 10 reform welfare, and provide adequate funding for 11 medicaid, education, agriculture, national defense, 12 veterans, and the environment. Further, the bal-

1	anced budget shall adopt tax policies to help working
2	families and stimulate future economic growth.
3	(2) The balanced budget agreement shall be es-
4	timated by the Congressional Budget Office based
5	on its most recent current economic and technical
6	assumptions, following a thorough consultation and
7	review with the Office of Management and Budget,
8	and other Government and private experts.
