Mr. BROWN introduced the following joint resolution; which was read twice
and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United
States relative to limiting congressional terms.

1 *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*
2 *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*
3 *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-*
4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several
8 States within seven years from the date of its submission
9 by the Congress:

1 “ARTICLE —

2 “SECTION 1. No person shall be elected to three con-
3 secutive terms in the Senate. No person shall be elected
4 to seven consecutive terms in the House of Representa-
5 tives.

6 “SECTION 2. Election or appointment to a partial
7 term shall not count against the limitations of section 1.

8 “SECTION 3. This article shall apply to elections fol-
9 lowing the date of ratification of this article.”.
