RESOLUTION

Designating James R. Ketchum as Curator Emeritus of the
United States Senate.

Whereas James R. Ketchum will retire from the United
States Senate after 25 years as Senate Curator, and 35
years of Government service;

Whereas he has dedicated his Senate service to preserving the
works of art, history, and traditions of the Senate;

Whereas he has contributed immeasurably to the restoration
of the Old Senate Chamber, the Old Supreme Court
Chamber, the President's Room, and other historic rooms
in the Capitol;

Whereas he has developed exhibitions and educational pro-
grams detailing the rich heritage of the Senate for all to
enjoy;

Whereas he has upheld the high standards and traditions of the Senate with abiding devotion; and

Whereas he has earned the respect, affection, and esteem of the United States Senate: Now, therefore, be it

1 *Resolved*, That, effective July 1, 1995, as a token of
2 the appreciation of the Senate for his long and faithful
3 service, James R. Ketchum is hereby designated as Cura-
4 tor Emeritus of the United States Senate.
