## RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the Senate that America's World War II veterans and their families are deserving of this Nation's respect and appreciation on the fiftieth anniversary of the end of the war in the Pacific.

Whereas on August 14, 1945, the Japanese Government accepted the Allied terms of surrender;

Whereas the formal documents of surrender were signed on September 2, 1945, thereby ending World War II;

Whereas fifty years have now passed since those events; and

Whereas the courage and sacrifice of the American fighting men and women who served with distinction in the Pacific and Asian theaters should always be remembered:  
Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved*, That the United States Senate joins with  
2 a grateful Nation in expressing our respect and apprecia-  
3 tion to the men and women who served in World War II,  
4 and their families. Further, we remember and pay tribute  
5 to those Americans who made the ultimate sacrifice and  
6 gave their life for their country.
