# S. RES. 259

To express the sense of the Senate that the Secretary of Agriculture should use the disaster reserve established under section 813 of the Agricultural Act of 1970 to alleviate distress to all livestock producers who have suffered feed losses due to drought, flooding, or other natural disasters in 1996 in the most cost efficient manner practicable, including cash payments from the sale of commodities in the disaster reserve, and should provide voluntary conservation assistance to persons who hay or graze on conservation reserve lands, and for other purposes.

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## RESOLUTION

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1       *Resolved,*

2   **SECTION 1. USE OF DISASTER RESERVE FOR DISASTER AS-**  
3                   **SISTANCE.**

4       It is the sense of the Senate that the Secretary of  
5   Agriculture should use the disaster reserve established  
6   under section 813 of the Agricultural Act of 1970 (7  
7   U.S.C. 1427a) to alleviate distress to livestock producers  
8   caused by drought, flood, or other natural disasters in  
9   1996, in the most efficient manner practicable, including  
10   cash payments from the sale of commodities currently in  
11   the disaster reserve. A livestock producer should be eligible  
12   to receive the assistance during the period beginning May  
13   1, 1996, and ending not sooner than August 31, 1996.

14   **SEC. 2. VOLUNTARY CONSERVATION ASSISTANCE.**

15       It is the sense of the Senate that the Secretary of  
16   Agriculture should use the authorities provided in the Fed-  
17   eral Agriculture Improvement and Reform Act of 1996  
18   (Public Law 104–127) to provide voluntary conservation  
19   assistance to any person who is permitted to hay or graze  
20   conservation reserve land on an emergency basis.

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
