- 4 ferred to in subsection (a) are the regulations issued by
- 5 the Office of Compliance on July 9, 1996, under section
- 6 220(d) of the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995
- 7 (2 U.S.C. 1351(d)) to implement section 220 of such Act
- 8 (relating to the application of chapter 71 of title 5, United
- 9 States Code), as published at 142 Cong. Rec. H7454
- 10 (daily ed. July 11, 1996).
- 11 SEC. 2. ADOPTION OF REGULATIONS RELATING TO HEAR-
- 12 ING OFFICERS.
- 13 The Board of Directors of the Office of Compliance
- 14 shall adopt regulations (in accordance with section 304 of
- 15 the Congressional Accountability Act of 1995 (2 U.S.C.
- 16 1384)) to implement the requirement that the Board refer
- 17 any matter under section 220(c)(1) of such Act (2 U.S.C.
- 18 1351(c)(1)) that relates to employing offices of the Senate
- 19 and employees of the Senate to a hearing officer.
