Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

Mr. COHEN (for himself and Mr. PRYOR) submitted the following resolution;
which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Special Committee on Aging.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Special Committee on Aging is authorized from March
8 1, 1995, through February 29, 1996, and March 1, 1996,
9 through February 28, 1997, in its discretion—

10 (1) to make expenditures from the contingent
11 fund of the Senate,

12 (2) to employ personnel, and

1 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
2 department or agency concerned and the Committee
3 on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
4 able or nonreimbursable basis the services of person-
5 nel of any such department or agency.

6 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
7 period March 1, 1995, through February 29, 1996, under
8 this resolution shall not exceed \$1,025,746.

9 (b) For the period March 1, 1996, through February
10 28, 1997, expenses of the committee under this resolution
11 shall not exceed \$1,048,589.

12 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
13 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
14 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable
15 date, but not later than February 29, 1996, and February
16 28, 1997, respectively.

17 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
18 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
19 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
20 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required—

21 (1) for the disbursement of salaries of employ-
22 ees paid at an annual rate,

23 (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
24 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and
25 Doorkeeper, United States Senate,

1 (3) for the payment of stationery supplies pur-
2 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery, United
3 States Senate,

4 (4) for payments to the Postmaster, United
5 States Senate,

6 (5) for the payment of metered charges on
7 copying equipment provided by the Office of the Ser-
8 geant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Sen-
9 ate, or

10 (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and
11 Photographic Services.

12 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
13 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
14 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
15 1995, through February 29, 1996, and March 1, 1996,
16 through February 28, 1997, to be paid from the Appro-
17 priations account for "Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
18 tigations."

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
