Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Labor and Human Resources.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JANUARY 18 (legislative day, JANUARY 10), 1995

Mrs. KASSEBAUM, from the Committee on Labor and Human Resources, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Labor and Human Resources.

1 *Resolved*, That, in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Committee on Labor and Human Resources is author-
8 ized from March 1, 1995, through February 28, 1996, and
9 March 1, 1996, through February 28, 1997, in its discre-
10 tion—

1 (1) to make expenditures from the contingent
2 fund of the Senate,

3 (2) to employ personnel, and

4 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
5 department or agency concerned and the Committee
6 on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
7 able or nonreimbursable basis the services of person-
8 nel of any such department or agency.

9 SEC. 2. The expenses of the committee for the period
10 March 1, 1995, through February 28, 1996, under this
11 resolution shall not exceed \$4,018,405, of which amount
12 not to exceed \$22,500 may be expended for the procure-
13 ment of the services of individual consultants, or organiza-
14 tion thereof (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legis-
15 lative Reorganization Act of 1946, as amended).

16 (b) For the period March 1, 1996, through February
17 28, 1997, expenses of the committee under this resolution
18 shall not exceed \$4,111,256, of which amount not to ex-
19 ceed \$22,500 may be expended for the procurement of the
20 services of individual consultants, or organizations thereof
21 (as authorized by section 202(i) of the Legislative Reorga-
22 nization Act of 1946, as amended).

23 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
24 gether with such recommendations for legislation as it
25 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable

1 date, but not later than February 28, 1996, and February
2 28, 1997, respectively.

3 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
4 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
5 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
6 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required—

7 (1) for the disbursement of salaries of employ-
8 ees paid at an annual rate,

9 (2) for the payment of telecommunications pro-
10 vided by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and
11 Doorkeeper, United States Senate,

12 (3) for the payment of stationery supplies pur-
13 chased through the Keeper of the Stationery, United
14 States Senate,

15 (4) for payments to the Postmaster, United
16 States Senate,

17 (5) for the payment of metered charges on
18 copying equipment provided by the Office of the Ser-
19 geant at Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Sen-
20 ate, or

21 (6) for the payment of Senate Recording and
22 Photographic Services.

23 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
24 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
25 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,

1 1995, through February 28, 1996, and March 1, 1996,
2 through February 28, 1997, to be paid from the Appro-
3 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
4 tigations”.
