Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

IN THE SENATE OF THE UNITED STATES

JANUARY 18 (legislative day, JANUARY 10), 1995

Mr. SIMPSON, from the Committee on Veterans' Affairs, reported the following original resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Rules and Administration

RESOLUTION

Authorizing expenditures by the Committee on Veterans' Affairs.

1 *Resolved*, That in carrying out its powers, duties, and
2 functions under the Standing Rules of the Senate, in ac-
3 cordance with its jurisdiction under rule XXV of such
4 rules, including holding hearings, reporting such hearings,
5 and making investigations as authorized by paragraphs 1
6 and 8 of rule XXVI of the Standing Rules of the Senate,
7 the Committee on Veterans' Affairs is authorized from
8 March 1, 1995, through February 29, 1996, and March
9 1, 1996, through February 28, 1997, in its discretion—

1 (1) to make expenditures from the contingent
2 fund of the Senate,

3 (2) to employ personnel, and

4 (3) with the prior consent of the Government
5 department or agency concerned and the Committee
6 on Rules and Administration, to use on a reimburs-
7 able or nonreimbursable basis the services of person-
8 nel of any such department or agency.

9 SEC. 2. (a) The expenses of the committee for the
10 period March 1, 1995, through February 29, 1996, under
11 this resolution shall not exceed \$1,036,481, of which not
12 to exceed \$3,000 may be expended for the training of the
13 professional staff of such committee (under procedures
14 specified by section 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganiza-
15 tion Act of 1946).

16 (b) For the period March 1, 1996, through February
17 28, 1997, expenses of the committee under this resolution
18 shall not exceed \$1,060,341, of which not to exceed \$3,000
19 may be expended for the training of the professional staff
20 of such committee (under procedures specified by section
21 202(j) of the Legislative Reorganization Act of 1946).

22 SEC. 3. The committee shall report its findings, to-
23 gether with such recommendation for legislation as it
24 deems advisable, to the Senate at the earliest practicable

1 date, but not later than February 29, 1996, and February
2 28, 1997, respectively.

3 SEC. 4. Expenses of the committee under this resolu-
4 tion shall be paid from the contingent fund of the Senate
5 upon vouchers approved by the chairman of the commit-
6 tee, except that vouchers shall not be required for—

7 (1) the disbursement of salaries of employees
8 paid at an annual rate,

9 (2) the payment of telecommunications provided
10 by the Office of the Sergeant at Arms and Door-
11 keeper, United States Senate,

12 (3) the payment of stationery supplies pur-
13 chased through the Keeper of Stationery, United
14 States Senate,

15 (4) payments to the Postmaster, United States
16 Senate,

17 (5) the payment of metered charges on copying
18 equipment provided by the Office of the Sergeant at
19 Arms and Doorkeeper, United States Senate, or

20 (6) the payment of Senate Recording and Pho-
21 tographic Services.

22 SEC. 5. There are authorized such sums as may be
23 necessary for agency contributions related to the com-
24 pensation of employees of the committee from March 1,
25 1995, through February 29, 1996, and March 1, 1996,

1 through February 28, 1997, to be paid from the appro-
2 priations account for “Expenses of Inquiries and Inves-
3 tigation”.

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
