REPORT

[To accompany H. Res. 267]

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 267, by a non-record vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution waives all points of order against the conference report to accompany H.R. 2020, the Department of Treasury and Postal Service Appropriations for Fiscal Year 1996, and against its consideration.

The rule further provides that if the conference report is adopted, then a motion that the House insist on its disagreement to Senate amendment 132 shall be considered as adopted.

The blanket waiver includes a waiver of clause 2 of rule XX, relating to legislation and unauthorized items on a general appropriations bill. The blanket waiver also includes a waiver of clause 3 of rule XXVIII, to protect provisions which exceed the scope of differences between the House and Senate. The blanket waiver further includes a waiver of clause 4(a) of rule XXVIII, relating to nongermane amendments to a conference report.
