REPORT

The Committee on Rules, having had under consideration House Resolution 289, by a nonrecord vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

BRIEF SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for the consideration of the conference report to accompany H.R. 2076, the “Commerce, Justice, State, the Judiciary and Related Agencies Appropriation Bill for Fiscal Year 1996”. The rule waives all points of order against the conference report and against its consideration.

The blanket waiver includes a waiver of clause 2 of Rule XX (relating to legislative and authorization matters in an appropriation conference report) and clause 3 of Rule XXVIII (relating to the scope of conference).
