## A BILL

To amend the Controlled Substances Act to prevent recommendations of the illegal use of controlled substances by registrants under that Act.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Medical Marijuana  
5 Prevention Act of 1997”.

6 **SEC. 2. SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION.**

7 Section 304 of the Controlled Substances Act (21 U.  
8 S.C. 824) is amended by adding at the end the following:

1       “(h) The Attorney General shall revoke the registra-  
2       tion of any registrant who, as a practitioner, recommends  
3       to a patient of that registrant a use which is illegal, under  
4       Federal law, of a controlled substance.”.
