A BILL

To amend title 18, United States Code, relating to war crimes.

1	Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2	tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
3	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
4	This Act may be cited as the "Expanded War Crimes
5	Act of 1997".
6	SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF WAR CRIMES.
7	Section 2441 of title 18, United States Code, is
8	amended—
9	(1) in subsection (a), by striking "grave breach
10	of the Geneva Conventions" and inserting "war
11	crime";
12	(2) in subsection (b), by striking "breach" each
13	place it appears and inserting "war crime";
14	(3) so that subsection (e) reads as follows:
15	"(e) Definition.—As used in this section—
16	"(1) the term 'war crime' means any conduct—
17	"(A) defined as a grave breach in any of
18	the international conventions signed at Geneva
19	12 August 1949, or any protocol to such con-
20	vention to which the United States is a party:

1	"(B) prohibited by Articles 23, 25, 17, or
2	28 of the Annex to the Hague Convention IV,
3	Respecting the Laws and Customs of War on
4	Land, signed 18 October 1907;
5	"(C) which constitutes a violation of com-
6	mon Article 3 of the international conventions
7	signed at Geneva 12 August 1949, or any pro-
8	tocol to such convention to which the United
9	States is a party and which deals with non-
10	international armed conflict; or
11	"(D) of a person who, in relation to an
12	armed conflict and contrary to the provisions of
13	the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on
14	the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other De-
15	vices as amended at Geneva on 3 May 1996
16	(Protocol II as amended on 3 May 1996), when
17	the United States is a party to such Protocol,
18	willfully kills or causes serious injury to civil-
19	ians.".
20	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
21	This Act may be cited as the "Expanded War Crimes
22	Act of 1997".
23	SEC. 2. DEFINITION OF WAR CRIMES.
24	Section 2441 of title 18, United States Code, is amend-

21	deals with non-international armed conflict; or
22	"(4) of a person who, in relation to an armed
23	conflict and contrary to the provisions of the Protocol
24	on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines,
25	Booby-Traps and Other Devices as amended at Gene-
