- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### SECTION 1. IMMEDIATE RELATIVE STATUS FOR MERCEDES

- 3 (a) In General.—Mercedes Del Carmen Quiroz
- 4 Martinez Cruz shall be classified as an immediate relative
- 5 within the meaning of section 201(b)(2)(A)(i) of the Im-
- 6 migration and Nationality Act for purposes of approval
- 7 of a relative visa petition filed under section 204 of such
- 8 Act by Mercedes Del Carmen Quiroz Martinez Cruz and
- 9 the filing of an application for an immigrant visa or for
- 10 adjustment of status.
- 11 (b) Adjustment of Status.—If Mercedes Del Car-
- 12 men Quiroz Martinez Cruz enters the United States before
- 13 the filing deadline specified in subsection (c), she shall be
- 14 considered to have entered and remained lawfully and
- 15 shall, if otherwise eligible, be eligible for adjustment of
- 16 status under section 245 of the Immigration and National-
- 17 ity Act as of the date of the enactment of this Act.
- 18 (c) Deadline for Application and Payment of
- 19 FEES.—Subsections (a) and (b) shall apply only if the pe-
- 20 tition and the application for issuance of an immigrant
- 21 visa or the application for adjustment of status are filed
- 22 by Mercedes Del Carmen Quiroz Martinez Cruz with ap-
- 23 propriate fees within 2 years after the date of the enact-
- 24 ment of this Act.
- 25 (d) Reduction of Immigrant Visa Number.—
- 26 Upon the granting of an immigrant visa or permanent res-

- 1 idence to Mercedes Del Carmen Quiroz Martinez Cruz, the
- 2 Secretary of State shall instruct the proper officer to re-
- 3 duce by 1, for the following fiscal year, the total number
- 4 of immigrant visas available under section 201(c)(1)(A)
- 5 of the Immigration and Nationality Act.
