# AN ACT

Making appropriations for military construction, family housing, and base realignment and closure for the Department of Defense for the fiscal year ending September 30, 1998, and for other purposes.

- 12 \$652,046,000, to remain available until September 30,
- 13 2002: Provided, That of this amount, not to exceed
- 14 \$71,577,000 \$77,646,000 shall be available for study,
- 15 planning, design, architect and engineer services, and host
- 16 nation support, as authorized by law, unless the Secretary
- 17 of Defense determines that additional obligations are nec-
- 18 essary for such purposes and notifies the Committees on
- 19 Appropriations of both Houses of Congress of his deter-
- 20 mination and the reasons therefor.

- 22 For acquisition, construction, installation, and equip-
- 23 ment of temporary or permanent public works, naval in-

- 15 ting forth the reasons therefor: Provided, That the fore-
- 16 going shall not apply in the case of contracts for environ-
- 17 mental restoration at an installation that is being closed
- 18 or realigned where payments are made from a Base Re-
- 19 alignment and Closure Account.
- 20 Sec. 102. Funds appropriated to the Department of
- 21 Defense for construction shall be available for hire of pas-
- 22 senger motor vehicles.
- 23 Sec. 103. Funds appropriated to the Department of
- 24 Defense for construction may be used for advances to the
- 25 Federal Highway Administration, Department of Trans-

- 1 portation, for the construction of access roads as author-
- 2 ized by section 210 of title 23, United States Code, when
- 3 projects authorized therein are certified as important to
- 4 the national defense by the Secretary of Defense.
- 5 Sec. 104. None of the funds appropriated in this Act
- 6 may be used to begin construction of new bases inside the
- 7 continental United States for which specific appropria-
- 8 tions have not been made.
- 9 Sec. 105. No part of the funds provided in Military
- 10 Construction Appropriations Acts shall be used for pur-
- 11 chase of land or land easements in excess of 100 per cen-
- 12 tum of the value as determined by the Army Corps of En-
- 13 gineers or the Naval Facilities Engineering Command, ex-
- 14 cept (1) where there is a determination of value by a Fed-
- 15 eral court, or (2) purchases negotiated by the Attorney
- 16 General or his designee, or (3) where the estimated value
- 17 is less than \$25,000, or (4) as otherwise determined by
- 18 the Secretary of Defense to be in the public interest.
- 19 Sec. 106. None of the funds appropriated in Military

- 6 Sec. 108. No part of the funds appropriated in Mili-
- 7 tary Construction Appropriations Acts may be used for
- 8 the procurement of steel for any construction project or
- 9 activity for which American steel producers, fabricators,
- 10 and manufacturers have been denied the opportunity to
- 11 compete for such steel procurement.
- 12 Sec. 109. None of the funds available to the Depart-
- 13 ment of Defense for military construction or family hous-
- 14 ing during the current fiscal year may be used to pay real
- 15 property taxes in any foreign nation.
- 16 Sec. 110. None of the funds appropriated in Military
- 17 Construction Appropriations Acts may be used to initiate
- 18 a new installation overseas without prior notification to
- 19 the Committees on Appropriations.
- Sec. 111. None of the funds appropriated in Military
- 21 Construction Appropriations Acts may be obligated for ar-
- 22 chitect and engineer contracts estimated by the Govern-
- 23 ment to exceed \$500,000 for projects to be accomplished
- 24 in Japan, in any NATO member country, or in countries
- 25 bordering the Arabian Gulf, unless such contracts are

- 1 awarded to United States firms or United States firms
- 2 in joint venture with host nation firms.
- 3 Sec. 112. None of the funds appropriated in Military
- 4 Construction Appropriations Acts for military construc-
- 5 tion in the United States territories and possessions in the
- 6 Pacific and on Kwajalein Atoll, or in countries bordering
- 7 the Arabian Gulf, may be used to award any contract esti-
- 8 mated by the Government to exceed \$1,000,000 to a for-

- 20 mittees on Appropriations, of the plans and scope of any
- 21 proposed military exercise involving United States person-
- 22 nel thirty days prior to its occurring, if amounts expended
- 23 for construction, either temporary or permanent, are an-
- 24 ticipated to exceed \$100,000.

- 1 Sec. 114. Not more than 20 per centum of the appro-
- 2 priations in Military Construction Appropriations Acts
- 3 which are limited for obligation during the current fiscal
- 4 year shall be obligated during the last two months of the

- 5 Sec. 120. During the current fiscal year, in addition
- 6 to any other transfer authority available to the Depart-
- 7 ment of Defense, proceeds deposited to the Department
- 8 of Defense Base Closure Account established by section
- 9 207(a)(1) of the Defense Authorization Amendments and
- 10 Base Closure and Realignment Act (Public Law 100–526)
- 11 pursuant to section 207(a)(2)(C) of such Act, may be
- 12 transferred to the account established by section
- 13 2906(a)(1) of the Department of Defense Authorization
- 14 Act, 1991, to be merged with, and to be available for the
- 15 same purposes and the same time period as that account.
- 16 Sec. 121. No funds appropriated pursuant to this
- 17 Act may be expended by an entity unless the entity agrees
- 18 that in expending the assistance the entity will comply
- 19 with sections 2 through 4 of the Act of March 3, 1933
- 20 (41 U.S.C. 10a–10e, popularly known as the "Buy Amer-
- 21 ican Act").
- 22 Sec. 122. (a) In the case of any equipment or prod-
- 23 uets that may be authorized to be purchased with financial
- 24 assistance provided under this Act, it is the sense of the
- 25 Congress that entities receiving such assistance should, in

- 1 expending the assistance, purchase only American-made
- 2 equipment and products.
- 3 (b) In providing financial assistance under this Act,
- 4 the Secretary of the Treasury shall provide to each recipi-
- 5 ent of the assistance a notice describing the statement
- 6 made in subsection (a) by the Congress.
- 7 (Transfer of Funds)
- 8 SEC. 123. During the current fiscal year, in addition

- 5 Sec. 127. (a) Lease of Property Authorized.—
- 6 (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Sec-
- 7 retary of the Navy (hereinafter referred to as the "Sec-
- 8 retary") may lease, without monetary consideration, to the
- 9 city and county of Honolulu (hereinafter referred to as the
- 10 "city") a parcel of land consisting of approximately 300
- 11 acres on Waipio Peninsula, Honolulu, Hawaii (hereinafter

  - (4) The city shall, at its own cost and to the satisfaction of the Secretary, make any and all improvements to Waipio Point Access Road which the city determines are necessary to provide onstreet parking along said road, and adequate access to the parcel, including, but not limited to, any necessary appurtenant utility and drainage improvements. During the term of said easement, the cost of maintenance, repair and replacement of said road and improvements shall be borne by the city.
  - (5) The city shall install a non-potable irrigation water delivery system to service the parcel, and in doing so, the city shall size transmission lines ca-

- 1 pable of delivering approximately 2.5 million addi-
- 2 tional gallons of irrigation water per day to agricul-
- 3 tural lands on Waipio Peninsula under the control of
- 4 the Secretary.
- 5 (e) Termination.—If the Secretary determines at any
- 6 time that the parcel is not being used for a purpose specified
- 7 in subsection (d)(1), the lease and easement authorized
- 8 under subsections (a) and (b) may be terminated, and all
- 9 right, title, and interest in and to such real property, in-
- 10 cluding any improvements thereon, shall revert to the Unit-
- 11 ed States, and the United States shall have the right of im-
- 12 mediate entry thereon.
- 13 (f) Effect of Expiration of Lease.—Unless other-
- 14 wise specifically provided for in this section, at the end of
- 15 the lease and easement term, the city shall either convey,
- 16 without reimbursement, to the United States, all right, title,
- 17 and interest of the city in and to the improvements subject
- 18 to said lease and easement, or restore, to the extent prac-
- 19 ticable, the lease and easement areas to the satisfaction of
- 20 the Secretary.
- 21 (g) Description of Property.—The exact acreage
- 22 and legal description of the property subject to this section
- 23 shall be determined by a survey satisfactory to the Sec-
- 24 retary. The cost of such survey shall be borne by the city.

1	(h) Additional Terms and Conditions.—The Sec-
2	retary may require such additional terms and conditions
3	in connection with the lease and easement to be granted
4	under this section as the Secretary considers appropriate
5	to protect the interests of the United States.
6	Sec. 128. (a) Not later than 60 days before issuing
7	any solicitation for a contract with the private sector for
