## SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF ELIGIBILITY TO RECEIVE DE PENDENCY AND INDEMNITY COMPENSATION TO SURVIVING SPOUSES WHOSE SUBSE QUENT MARRIAGES HAVE TERMINATED.

5 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 1311 of title 38, United
6 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the follow7 ing new subsection:

8 "(e)(1) The remarriage of the surviving spouse of a 9 veteran shall not bar the furnishing of dependency and 10 indemnity compensation to such person as the surviving 11 spouse of the veteran if the remarriage is terminated by 12 death or divorce, unless the Secretary determines that the 13 death or divorce was secured through fraud by the surviv-14 ing spouse or collusion.

15 "(2) If the surviving spouse of a veteran ceases living 16 with another person and holding himself or herself out 17 openly to the public as that person's spouse, section 18 101(3) shall not bar eligibility of that person to receive 19 dependency and indemnity compensation."

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—No payment may be made
pursuant to the amendment made by subsection (a) for
any month beginning before October 1, 1997.
