1 **SECTION 1. REPEAL OF CRIMINAL PENALTY FOR FRAUDU-**
2 **LENT DISPOSITION OF ASSETS IN ORDER TO**
3 **OBTAIN MEDICAID BENEFITS.**

4 Effective as if included in the enactment of the
5 Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of
6 1996, section 1128B(a) of the Social Security Act (42
7 U.S.C. 1320a–7b(a)), as amended by section 217 of the
8 Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of
9 1996, is amended—

10 (1) by adding “or” at the end of paragraph (4);

11 (2) by striking “or” at the end of paragraph

12 (5) and inserting a period; and

13 (3) by striking paragraph (6).

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
