3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Community Empower-
- 5 ment and Employee Protection Act".

1 SEC. 2. DOE WORKER AND COMMUNITY TRANSITION OF 2 FICE.

3 (a) GENERAL RULE.—There are authorized to be appropriated to the Secretary of Energy an amount equal 4 5 to the amount described in subsection (b). Such amount shall be used to provide a fund for the Worker and Com-6 7 munity Transition Office of the Department of Energy to 8 allocate to the communities surrounding and the workers 9 at the Piketon, Ohio and Paducah, Kentucky uranium en-10 richment plants to help train displaced workers and to as-11 sist in ascertaining future business opportunities for such workers. The allocation of funds would be directly related 12 to the unemployment rates at the respective sites. 13

14 (b) FUND.—The amount authorized to be appropriated under subsection (a) in any fiscal year is the 15 16 amount paid as tax to the Federal Government by the United States Enrichment Corporation in such fiscal year. 17 18 (c) TERMINATION.—The authorization of appropria-19 tions to the Secretary of Energy and the fund to be managed by the Worker and Community Transition Office of 20 the Department of Energy shall terminate when the local 21 22 unemployment rates in the counties surrounding both the 23 Piketon and Paducah facilities are not greater than the 24 average unemployment rate for the States in which such cities are located. 25
