AN ACT

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Persian Gulf War Vet-5 erans Health Care and Research Act of 1998".

6 SEC. 2. HEALTH CARE FOR VETERANS OF WAR.

7 (a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE PRIORITY CARE.—Sec8 tion 1710(e) of title 38, United States Code, is amended—

9 (1) by adding at the end of paragraph (1) the10 following new subparagraph:

11 "(D) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3), a veteran 12 who served on active duty in a theater of combat oper-13 ations (as determined by the Secretary in consultation 14 with the Secretary of Defense) during a period of war 15 after the Vietnam era, or in combat against a hostile force 16 during a period of hostilities (as defined in section 1712A(a)(2)(B) of this title) after the date of the enact-17 ment of this subparagraph, is eligible for hospital care, 18 19 medical services, and nursing home care under subsection 20(a)(2)(F) for any illness, notwithstanding that there is insufficient medical evidence to conclude that such condition 21 is attributable to such service."; 22

23 (2) in paragraph (2)(B), by inserting "or
24 (1)(D)" after "paragraph (1)(C)";

6 (2) by inserting ", and veterans described in
7 subparagraph (F) of section 1710(a)(2) of this title"
8 after "disabled".

9 SEC. 3. NATIONAL CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF WAR-RELAT10 ED ILLNESSES.

(a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Chapter 73 of title 38, United
States Code, is amended by inserting after section 7322
the following new section:

14 "§ 7323. National Center for the Study of War-Related

15

Illnesses

"(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The 16 Secretary, acting 17 through the Under Secretary for Health, shall establish and operate in the Veterans Health Administration a Na-18 tional Center for the Study of War-Related Illnesses (here-19 inafter in this section referred to as the 'Center'). The 20 21 Center shall, as appropriate, coordinate its activities with 22 those of the National Center on Post-Traumatic-Stress 23 Disorder established pursuant to section 110(c) of the 24 Veterans' Health Care Act of 1984 (Public Law 98–528).

1 "(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of the Center shall 2 be to promote improvement of clinical, research, and edu-3 cational activities of the Veterans Health Administration 4 with respect to war-related illnesses, including medically 5 unexplained illnesses.

6 "(c) FUNCTIONS.—In carrying out the purposes of
7 the Center, the Under Secretary shall ensure that the Cen8 ter—

9 "(1) promotes the training of health care and 10 related personnel in, and research into, the causes, 11 mechanisms, and treatment of war-related illnesses; "(2) serves as a resource center for, and pro-12 13 motes and seeks to coordinate the exchange of infor-14 mation regarding, research and training activities 15 carried out by the Department, the Department of 16 Defense, and other Federal and non-Federal entities; 17 and

18 "(3) coordinates with the Department of De-19 fense and other interested Federal departments and 20 agencies in the conduct of research, training, and 21 treatment and the dissemination of information per-22 taining to war-related illnesses.

"(d) STAFF.—The Under Secretary shall ensure that
the staff of the Center has an appropriate range and
breadth of expertise so as to enable the Center to bring

an interdisciplinary approach to the study and treatment
 of war-related illnesses.

3 "(e) COORDINATION BETWEEN DEPARTMENTS.—(1)
4 In order to ensure needed coordination between the De5 partment and the Department of Defense in carrying out
6 the mission of the Center, the officials identified in sub7 paragraphs (A) and (B) of section 8111(b)(2) of this title
8 shall—

9 "(A) meet regularly to review pertinent policies, 10 procedures, and practices of their respective depart-11 ments relating to such coordination and to identify 12 actions that could be taken to change policies, proce-13 dures, and practices to improve such coordination; 14 and

15 "(B) take all appropriate steps to carry out16 those actions identified under paragraph (1).

17 "(2) The Secretary and the Secretary of Defense
18 shall submit to the appropriate committees of Congress
19 an annual joint report, not later than April 1 each year,
20 on the activities under paragraph (1) during the preceding
21 year.".

(2) The table of sections at the beginning of such
chapter is amended by inserting after the item relating
to section 7322 the following new item:

"7323. National Center for the Study of War-Related Illnesses.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The National Center for the
 Study of War-Related Illnesses required to be established
 by section 7323 of title 38, United States Code, as added
 by subsection (a), shall be established not later than Octo ber 1, 1999.

6 SEC. 4. ASSESSMENT OF EFFECTIVENESS OF CARE OF PER7 SIAN GULF WAR VETERANS.

8 (a) Assessment BY NATIONAL ACADEMY OF 9 SCIENCES.—Not later than November 1, 1998, the Sec-10 retary of Veterans Affairs shall enter into a contract with the National Academy of Sciences for the conduct of a 11 review of a methodology which could be used by the De-12 13 partment of Veterans Affairs for determining the efficacy of treatments furnished to, and health outcomes (to in-14 15 clude functional status) of, Persian Gulf War veterans who have been treated for illnesses which may be associated 16 with their service in the Persian Gulf War. 17

(b) ACTION ON REPORT.—Not later than 180 days
after receiving the final report of the National Academy
of Sciences under subsection (a), the Secretary shall—

(1) if scientifically feasible, develop an appropriate mechanism to monitor and study the effectiveness of treatments furnished to, and health outcomes of, Persian Gulf War veterans who suffer
from diagnosed and undiagnosed illnesses which may

2 War; and (2) submit to the Committees on Veterans' Af-3 4 fairs of the Senate and House of Representatives a 5 report on the implementation of this subsection. SEC. 5. CONTRACT FOR INDEPENDENT RECOMMENDA-6 7 TIONS ON RESEARCH AND FOR DEVELOP-8 MENT OF CURRICULUM ON CARE OF PER-9 SIAN GULF WAR VETERANS.

Section 706 of the Persian Gulf War Veterans'
Health Status Act (title VII of Public Law 102–585; 38
U.S.C. 527 note) is amended by adding at the end thereof
the following new subsection:

"(d) RESEARCH REVIEW AND DEVELOPMENT OF 14 15 MEDICAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM.—(1) In order to further understanding of the health consequences of military 16 service in the Persian Gulf theater of operations and of 17 new research findings with implications for improving the 18 provision of care for veterans of such service, the Sec-19 20 retary of Veterans Affairs and the Secretary of Defense 21 shall seek to enter into an agreement with the National 22 Academy of Sciences under which the Institute of Medi-23 cine of the Academy would—

24 "(A) develop a curriculum pertaining to the25 care and treatment of veterans of such service who

be associated with their service in the Persian Gulf

have ill-defined or undiagnosed illnesses for use in
 the continuing medical education of both general
 and specialty physicians who provide care for such
 veterans; and

"(B) periodically review and provide 5 rec-6 ommendations regarding the research plans and re-7 search strategies of the Departments relating to the 8 health consequences of military service in the Per-9 sian Gulf theater of operations during the Persian 10 Gulf War, including recommendations that the 11 Academy considers appropriate for additional scientific studies to resolve areas of continuing sci-12 13 entific uncertainty relating to the health con-14 sequences of any aspects of such military service.

15 "(2) Not later than 6 months after the Institute of Medicine provides the Secretaries the curriculum devel-16 17 oped under paragraph (1), the Secretaries shall provide 18 for the conduct of continuing education programs using 19 the curriculum developed under paragraph (1). Such programs shall include instruction which seeks to emphasize 20 21 use of appropriate protocols of diagnosis, referral, and 22 treatment of such veterans.".

SEC. 6. REVISION TO PROCESS FOR DETERMINING PRIOR ITIES FOR HEALTH-RELATED RESEARCH ON THE PERSIAN GULF WAR.

4 Section 707 of the Persian Gulf War Veterans'
5 Health Status Act (title VII of Public Law 102–585; 38
6 U.S.C. 527 note) is amended by striking out subsection
7 (b) and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

8 "(b) PUBLIC ADVISORY COMMITTEE.—Not later than 9 January 1, 1999, the head of the department or agency designated under subsection (a) shall establish an advisory 10 11 committee consisting of members of the general public, to include Persian Gulf War veterans and representatives of 12 13 such veterans, to provide advice to the head of that depart-14 ment or agency on proposed research studies, research plans, or research strategies relating to the health con-15 16 sequences of military service in the Persian Gulf theater of operations during the Persian Gulf War. The depart-17 18 ment or agency head shall consult with such advisory com-19 mittee on a regular basis.

"(c) REPORTS.—(1) Not later than March 1 of each
year, the head of the department or agency designated
under subsection (a) shall submit to the Committees on
Veterans' Affairs of the Senate and House of Representatives a report on—

"(A) the status and results of all such research
 activities undertaken by the executive branch during
 the previous year;

4 "(B) research priorities identified during that
5 year; and

6 "(C) recommendations of the public advisory
7 committee established under subsection (b) that
8 were not adopted during that year and the reasons
9 for not adopting each such recommendation.

10 "(2)(A) Not later than 120 days after submission of 11 the epidemiological research study conducted by the De-12 partment of Veterans Affairs entitled 'VA National Survey 13 of Persian Gulf Veterans—Phase III', the head of the de-14 partment or agency designated under subsection (a) shall 15 submit to the congressional committees specified in para-16 graph (1) a report on the findings under that study.

17 "(B) With respect to any findings of that study which identify scientific evidence of a greater relative risk of ill-18 ness or illnesses in family members of veterans who served 19 in the Persian Gulf War theater of operations than in fam-20 21 ily members of veterans who did not so serve, the head 22 of the department or agency designated under subsection 23 (a) shall seek to ensure that appropriate research studies 24 are designed to follow up on such findings.

1 "(d) Public Availability of Research Find-2 INGS.—The head of the department or agency designated 3 under subsection (a) shall ensure that the findings of all 4 research conducted by or for the executive branch relating 5 to the health consequences of military service in the Persian Gulf theater of operations during the Persian Gulf 6 7 War (including information pertinent to improving provi-8 sion of care for veterans of such service) are made avail-9 able to the public through peer-reviewed medical journals, 10 the Internet World Wide Web, and other appropriate 11 media.".

12 SEC. 7. DESIGNATION OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF-13 FAIRS MEDICAL CENTER IN ASPINWALL, 14 PENNSYLVANIA.

15 The Department of Veterans Affairs medical center in Aspinwall, Pennsylvania, is hereby designated as the 16 17 "H. John Heinz III Department of Veterans Affairs Medi-18 cal Center". Any reference to that medical center in any law, regulation, map, document, record, or other paper of 19 the United States shall be considered to be a reference 20 21 to the "H. John Heinz III Department of Veterans Affairs 22 Medical Center".

SEC. 8. DESIGNATION OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF FAIRS MEDICAL CENTER IN GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA.

4 The Department of Veterans Affairs medical center 5 Gainesville, Florida, is hereby designated as the in "Malcom Randall Department of Veterans Affairs Medical 6 7 Center". Any reference to that medical center in any law, 8 regulation, map, document, record, or other paper of the 9 United States shall be considered to be a reference to the "Malcom Randall Department of Veterans Affairs Medical 10 11 Center".

12 SEC. 9. MANAGEMENT OF SPECIALIZED TREATMENT AND 13 REHABILITATIVE PROGRAMS.

14 (a) STANDARDS OF JOB PERFORMANCE.—Section15 1706(b) of title 38, United States Code, is amended—

(1) in paragraph (2), by striking out "April 1,
17 1997, April 1, 1998, and April 1, 1999", and insert18 ing in lieu thereof "April 1, 1999, April 1, 2000,
19 and April 1, 2001"; and

20 (2) by adding at the end the following new21 paragraph:

"(3)(A) To ensure compliance with paragraph (1),
the Under Secretary for Health shall prescribe objective
standards of job performance for employees in positions
described in subparagraph (B) with respect to the job performance of those employees in carrying out the require-

ments of paragraph (1). Those job performance standards
 shall include measures of workload, allocation of re sources, and quality-of-care indicators.

4 "(B) Positions described in this subparagraph are po5 sitions in the Veterans Health Administration that have
6 responsibility for allocating and managing resources appli7 cable to the requirements of paragraph (1).

8 "(C) The Under Secretary shall develop the job per-9 formance standards under subparagraph (A) in consulta-10 tion with the Advisory Committee on Prosthetics and Spe-11 cial Disabilities Programs and the Committee on Care of 12 Severely Chronically Mentally Ill Veterans.".

(b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The standards of job performance required by paragraph (3) of section 1706(b) of
title 38, United States Code, as added by subsection (a),
shall be prescribed not later than January 1, 1999.

17SEC. 10. EXTENSION OF AUTHORITY TO COUNSEL AND18TREAT VETERANS FOR SEXUAL TRAUMA.

Section 1720D(a) of title 38, United States Code, is
amended by striking out "December 31, 1998" in paragraphs (1) and (3) and inserting in lieu thereof "December 31, 2001".

SEC. 11. AUTHORIZATION OF CONSTRUCTION OF A SPINAL CORD INJURY CENTER AT THE TAMPA, FLOR IDA, VAMC.

4 (a) AUTHORIZATION.—The Secretary of Veterans Af5 fairs may carry out a major medical facility project for
6 construction of a spinal cord injury center at the Depart7 ment of Veterans Affairs Medical Center, Tampa, Florida,
8 in an amount not to exceed \$46,300,000.

9 (b) FUNDING.—There are authorized to be appro-10 priated to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs for fiscal year 11 1999 for the Construction, Major Projects, account 12 \$20,000,000 to be available for the project authorized in 13 subsection (a).

14 (c) SOURCE OF FUNDS.—The project authorized in
15 subsection (a) may be carried out using —

- 16 (A) funds appropriated pursuant to the author-17 ization of appropriations in subsection (b);
- (B) funds appropriated for Construction, Major
 Projects, for a fiscal year before fiscal year 1999
 that remain available for obligation; and

(C) funds appropriated for Construction, Major
 Projects, for a fiscal year before fiscal year 1999 for
 a category of activity not specific to a project.
