A BILL

 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Persian Gulf War Veter5 ans Health Care and Research Act of 1998".

6 SEC. 2. HEALTH CARE FOR VETERANS OF WAR.

- 7 (a) AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE PRIORITY CARE.—Sec8 tion 1710(e) of title 38, United States Code, is amended—
- 9 (1) by adding at the end of paragraph (1) the
 10 following new subparagraph:
- "(D) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3), a veteran who
 served on active duty in a theater of combat operations (as
 determined by the Secretary in consultation with the Secretary of Defense) during a period of war after the Vietnam

1	era, or in combat against a hostile force during a period
2	of hostilities (as defined in section $1712A(a)(2)(B)$ of this
3	title) after the date of the enactment of this subparagraph,
4	is eligible for hospital care, medical services, and nursing
5	home care under subsection $(a)(2)(F)$ for any illness, not-
6	withstanding that there is insufficient medical evidence to
7	conclude that such condition is attributable to such serv-
8	ice.";
9	(2) in paragraph (2)(B), by inserting "or
10	(1)(D)" after "paragraph (1)(C)";
11	(3) in paragraph (3)—
12	(A) by striking out "and" at the end of sub-
13	paragraph (A);
14	(B) by striking out "December 31, 1998."
15	in subparagraph (B) and inserting in lieu there-
16	of "December 31, 2001; and"; and
17	(C) by adding at the end the following new
18	subparagraph:
19	(C) in the case of care for a veteran described
20	in paragraph $(1)(D)$, after a period of five years be-
21	ginning on the date of the veteran's discharge or re-
22	lease from active military, naval, or air service."; and
23	(4) by adding at the end the following new para-
24	graph:

1 "(5) When the Secretary first provides care for veter-2 ans using the authority provided in paragraph (1)(D), the Secretary shall submit to Congress a report on the experi-3 4 ence under that authority. The report shall cover the period of the first three years during which that authority is used 5 and shall be submitted not later than nine months after 6 7 the end of that three-year period. The Secretary shall in-8 clude in the report any recommendations of the Secretary for extension of that authority.". 9

10 (b) ENROLLMENT PRIORITY.—Section 1705(a)(4) of
11 such title is amended—

12 (1) by striking out "and" after "permanently
13 housebound" and inserting in lieu thereof a comma;
14 and

(2) by inserting ", and veterans described in subparagraph (F) of section 1710(a)(2) of this title" after
"disabled".

18 SEC. 3. NATIONAL CENTER FOR THE STUDY OF WAR-RELAT-

19 ED ILLNESSES.

20 (a) IN GENERAL.—(1) Chapter 73 of title 38, United
21 States Code, is amended by inserting after section 7322 the
22 following new section:

3 "(a) ESTABLISHMENT.—The Secretary, acting through the Under Secretary for Health, shall establish and operate 4 in the Veterans Health Administration a National Center 5 for the Study of War-Related Illnesses (hereinafter in this 6 7 section referred to as the 'Center'). The Center shall, as appropriate, coordinate its activities with those of the Na-8 tional Center on Post-Traumatic-Stress Disorder estab-9 10 lished pursuant to section 110(c) of the Veterans' Health Care Act of 1984 (Public Law 98–528). 11

12 "(b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of the Center shall be to promote improvement of clinical, research, and edu-13 cational activities of the Veterans Health Administration 14 15 with respect to war-related illnesses, including medically 16 unexplained illnesses.

17 "(c) FUNCTIONS.—In carrying out the purposes of the 18 Center, the Under Secretary shall ensure that the Center—

19 "(1) promotes the training of health care and re-20 lated personnel in, and research into, the causes, 21 mechanisms, and treatment of war-related illnesses;

22 "(2) serves as a resource center for, and promotes and seeks to coordinate the exchange of information 23 24 regarding, research and training activities carried 25 out by the Department, the Department of Defense, 26

"(3) coordinates with the Department of Defense
 and other interested Federal departments and agen cies in the conduct of research, training, and treat ment and the dissemination of information pertain ing to war-related illnesses.

6 "(d) STAFF.—The Under Secretary shall ensure that 7 the staff of the Center has an appropriate range and breadth 8 of expertise so as to enable the Center to bring an inter-9 disciplinary approach to the study and treatment of war-10 related illnesses.

11 "(e) COORDINATION BETWEEN DEPARTMENTS.—(1) In
12 order to ensure needed coordination between the Depart13 ment and the Department of Defense in carrying out the
14 mission of the Center, the officials identified in subpara15 graphs (A) and (B) of section 8111(b)(2) of this title shall—

"(A) meet regularly to review pertinent policies,
procedures, and practices of their respective departments relating to such coordination and to identify
actions that could be taken to change policies, procedures, and practices to improve such coordination;
and

22 "(B) take all appropriate steps to carry out those
23 actions identified under paragraph (1).

24 "(2) The Secretary and the Secretary of Defense shall
25 submit to the appropriate committees of Congress an an-

nual joint report, not later than April 1 each year, on the
 activities under paragraph (1) during the preceding year.".

3 (2) The table of sections at the beginning of such chap4 ter is amended by inserting after the item relating to section
5 7322 the following new item:

"7323. National Center for the Study of War-Related Illnesses.".

6 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The National Center for the
7 Study of War-Related Illnesses required to be established
8 by section 7323 of title 38, United States Code, as added
9 by subsection (a), shall be established not later than October
10 1, 1999.

11SEC. 4. ASSESSMENT OF EFFECTIVENESS OF CARE OF PER-12SIAN GULF WAR VETERANS.

13 Assessment BYNATIONAL (a)ACADEMY OF14 SCIENCES.—Not later than November 1, 1998, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall enter into a contract with the Na-15 tional Academy of Sciences for the conduct of a review of 16 17 a methodology which could be used by the Department of Veterans Affairs for determining the efficacy of treatments 18 furnished to, and health outcomes (to include functional sta-19 tus) of, Persian Gulf War veterans who have been treated 20 21 for illnesses which may be associated with their service in 22 the Persian Gulf War.

(b) ACTION ON REPORT.—Not later than 180 days
after receiving the final report of the National Academy of
Sciences under subsection (a), the Secretary shall—

1	(1) if scientifically feasible, develop an appro-
2	priate mechanism to monitor and study the effective-
3	ness of treatments furnished to, and health outcomes
4	of, Persian Gulf War veterans who suffer from diag-
5	nosed and undiagnosed illnesses which may be associ-
6	ated with their service in the Persian Gulf War; and
7	(2) submit to the Committees on Veterans' Af-
8	fairs of the Senate and House of Representatives a re-
9	port on the implementation of this subsection.

Sciences under which the Institute of Medicine of the Acad emy would—

3 "(A) develop a curriculum pertaining to the care
4 and treatment of veterans of such service who have ill5 defined or undiagnosed illnesses for use in the con6 tinuing medical education of both general and spe7 cialty physicians who provide care for such veterans;
8 and

9 (B)periodically review and provide rec-10 ommendations regarding the research plans and re-11 search strategies of the Departments relating to the 12 health consequences of military service in the Persian 13 Gulf theater of operations during the Persian Gulf 14 War, including recommendations that the Academy 15 considers appropriate for additional scientific studies 16 to resolve areas of continuing scientific uncertainty 17 relating to the health consequences of any aspects of 18 such military service.

19 "(2) Not later than six months after the Institute of 20 Medicine provides the Secretaries the curriculum developed 21 under paragraph (1), the Secretaries shall provide for the 22 conduct of continuing education programs using the cur-23 riculum developed under paragraph (1). Such programs 24 shall include instruction which seeks to emphasize use of appropriate protocols of diagnosis, referral, and treatment
 of such veterans.".

3 SEC. 6. REVISION TO PROCESS FOR DETERMINING PRIOR4 ITIES FOR HEALTH-RELATED RESEARCH ON 5 THE PERSIAN GULF WAR.

6 Section 707 of the Persian Gulf War Veterans' Health
7 Status Act (title VII of Public Law 102–585; 38 U.S.C. 527
8 note) is amended by striking out subsection (b) and insert9 ing in lieu thereof the following:

10 "(b) Public Advisory Committee.—Not later than January 1, 1999, the head of the department or agency des-11 12 ignated under subsection (a) shall establish an advisory committee consisting of members of the general public, to 13 include Persian Gulf War veterans and representatives of 14 15 such veterans, to provide advice to the head of that department or agency on proposed research studies, research 16 plans, or research strategies relating to the health con-17 sequences of military service in the Persian Gulf theater of 18 operations during the Persian Gulf War. The department 19 or agency head shall consult with such advisory committee 20 21 on a regular basis.

(c) REPORTS.—(1) Not later than March 1 of each
year, the head of the department or agency designated under
subsection (a) shall submit to the Committees on Veterans'

Affairs of the Senate and House of Representatives a report
 on—

3 "(A) the status and results of all such research
4 activities undertaken by the executive branch during
5 the previous year;

6 "(B) research priorities identified during that
7 year; and

8 "(C) recommendations of the public advisory 9 committee established under subsection (b) that were 10 not adopted during that year and the reasons for not 11 adopting each such recommendation.

12 "(2)(A) Not later than 120 days after submission of 13 the epidemiological research study conducted by the Depart-14 ment of Veterans Affairs entitled 'VA National Survey of 15 Persian Gulf Veterans—Phase III', the head of the depart-16 ment or agency designated under subsection (a) shall sub-17 mit to the congressional committees specified in paragraph 18 (1) a report on the findings under that study.

19 "(B) With respect to any findings of that study which 20 identify scientific evidence of a greater relative risk of ill-21 ness or illnesses in family members of veterans who served 22 in the Persian Gulf War theater of operations than in fam-23 ily members of veterans who did not so serve, the head of 24 the department or agency designated under subsection (a) shall seek to ensure that appropriate research studies are
 designed to follow up on such findings.

3 "(d) PUBLIC AVAILABILITY OF RESEARCH FIND-4 INGS.—The head of the department or agency designated under subsection (a) shall ensure that the findings of all 5 research conducted by or for the executive branch relating 6 7 to the health consequences of military service in the Persian 8 Gulf theater of operations during the Persian Gulf War (in-9 cluding information pertinent to improving provision of care for veterans of such service) are made available to the 10 public through peer-reviewed medical journals, the Internet 11 12 World Wide Web, and other appropriate media.".

13 SEC. 7. DESIGNATION OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF14 FAIRS MEDICAL CENTER IN ASPINWALL, 15 PENNSYLVANIA.

16 The Department of Veterans Affairs medical center in Aspinwall, Pennsylvania, is hereby designated as the "H. 17 John Heinz III Department of Veterans Affairs Medical 18 19 Center". Any reference to that medical center in any law, regulation, map, document, record, or other paper of the 20 21 United States shall be considered to be a reference to the 22 "H. John Heinz III Department of Veterans Affairs Medi-23 cal Center".

SEC. 8. DESIGNATION OF DEPARTMENT OF VETERANS AF FAIRS MEDICAL CENTER IN GAINESVILLE, FLORIDA. The Department of Veterans Affairs medical center in
