- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. INFORMATION TO BE REQUESTED.
- 4 (a) In General.—The long form used in carrying
- 5 out the 2000 decennial census of population shall, in addi-
- 6 tion to any other information requested, contain the fol-
- 7 lowing questions (or questions to the same effect):

1	(1) Does your household have a personal com-
2	puter?
3	(2) Is your household currently connected to
4	the Internet through a personal computer or other
5	device?
6	(b) Definition.—For purposes of this Act, the term
7	"census of population" has the meaning given such term
8	by section 141(g) of title 13, United States Code.
