A BILL

To provide for the conveyance of small parcels of land in the Carson National Forest and the Santa Fe National Forest, New Mexico, to the village of El Rito and the town of Jemez Springs, New Mexico.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. LAND CONVEYANCE, CARSON NATIONAL FOR-4 EST, NEW MEXICO.

5 (a) CONVEYANCE REQUIRED.—The Secretary of Ag6 riculture shall convey, without consideration, to the village
7 of El Rito, New Mexico (in this section referred to as "El
8 Rito"), all right, title, and interest of the United States

in and to a parcel of real property, together with any im provements thereon, consisting of approximately five acres
 located in the Carson National Forest in the State of New
 Mexico.

5 (b) CONDITION OF CONVEYANCE.—The conveyance
6 under subsection (a) shall be subject to the condition that
7 El Rito agrees to use the real property for the purpose
8 of expending the El Rito cemetery.

9 (c) REVERSIONARY INTEREST.—If the Secretary de-10 termines that the real property conveyed under subsection 11 (a) is not being used in accordance with the condition in 12 subsection (b), all right, title, and interest in and to the 13 property shall revert to the United States, and the United 14 States shall have immediate right of entry thereon.

(d) DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY.—The exact acreage
and legal description of the real property conveyed under
subsection (a) shall be determined by a survey satisfactory
to the Secretary. The cost of the survey shall be borne
by El Rito.

(e) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The
Secretary may require such additional terms and conditions in connection with conveyance under subsection (a)
as the Secretary considers appropriate to protect the interests of the United States.

3 (a) CONVEYANCE REQUIRED.—The Secretary of Agriculture shall convey, without consideration, to the town 4 5 of Jemez Springs, New Mexico (in this section referred to as "Jemez Springs"), all right, title, and interest of 6 7 the United States in and to a parcel of real property, to-8 gether with any improvements thereon, consisting of approximately one acre located in the Santa Fe National 9 Forest in the State of New Mexico. 10

(b) CONDITION OF CONVEYANCE.—The conveyance
under subsection (a) shall be subject to the condition that
Jemez Springs agrees to use the real property for the purpose of constructing and operating a fire sub-station for
Jemez Springs.

16 (c) REVERSIONARY INTEREST.—If the Secretary de-17 termines that the real property conveyed under subsection 18 (a) is not being used in accordance with the condition in 19 subsection (b), all right, title, and interest in and to the 20 property shall revert to the United States, and the United 21 States shall have immediate right of entry thereon.

(d) DESCRIPTION OF PROPERTY.—The exact acreage
and legal description of the real property conveyed under
subsection (a) shall be determined by a survey satisfactory
to the Secretary. The cost of the survey shall be borne
by Jemez Springs.

(e) ADDITIONAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS.—The
 Secretary may require such additional terms and condi tions in connection with conveyance under subsection (a)
 as the Secretary considers appropriate to protect the inter ests of the United States.
