5 Section 1710 of title 38, United States Code, is6 amended—

(1) in subsection (a)(2)(F), by inserting "or
who while serving in the active military, naval, or air
service between January 1, 1940, and December 31,
1965, received one or more nasopharyngeal radium
irradiation treatments," after "or other conditions,";
and

(2) in subsection (e)(1)(B), by inserting ", or a
veteran who while serving in the active military,
naval, or air service between January 1, 1940, and
December 31, 1965, received one or more nasopharyngeal radium irradiation treatments while serving in the active military, naval or air service," after
"radiation-exposed veteran".

20 SEC. 2. EXAMINATION AND INCLUSION IN REGISTRY.

The Secretary of Veterans Affairs may examine, at
no cost to the veteran, any veteran who received one or
more nasopharyngeal radium irradiation treatments for either clinical or occupational purposes while serving in the
active military, naval, or air service between January 1,
1940, and December 31, 1965. The Secretary may include
