To designate former United States Route 66 as "America's Main Street" and authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide assistance.

Mrs. Wilson (for herself, Mr. English of Pennsylvania, and Ms. MILLENDER-McDonald) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Resources

## A BILL

To designate former United States Route 66 as "America's Main Street" and authorize the Secretary of the Interior to provide assistance.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 **SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS.** In this Act: 4 (1) ROUTE 66.—The term "Route 66" means— 5 (A) portions of the highway formerly des-6 ignated as United States Route 66 that remain 7 in existence as of the date of enactment of this 8 9

Act; and

- 1 (B) public and private land in the vicinity 2 of the highway. (2) Preservation office.—The term "Pres-3 ervation Office" means the Office for the Preserva-4 tion of America's Main Street established by the 5 6 Secretary under section 3. 7 (3) Preservation of route 66.—The term "preservation of Route 66" means the preservation 8 9 or restoration of portions of the highway, businesses 10 and sites of interest or potentially of interest to the 11 public along the highway, or other resources of the 12 highway. (4) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means 13 14 the Secretary of the Interior, acting through the Di-15 rector of the National Park Service. (5) STATE.—The term "State" means a State 16 17 in which a portion of Route 66 is located. 18 SEC. 2. DESIGNATION. 19 Route 66 is designated as "America's Main Street".
- 20 SEC. 3. MANAGEMENT.
- 21 (a) Establishment of Office.—The Secretary
- 22 shall establish an office, to be known as the "Office for
- 23 the Preservation of America's Main Street".
- 24 (b) Designation of Officials.—The Secretary
- 25 shall designate officials of the National Park Service sta-

- tioned at locations convenient to the States and interested persons in the States, to perform the functions of the Preservation Office under this Act. 4 (c) General Functions.—The Preservation Office 5 shall— 6 (1) support efforts of State and local public and 7 private persons and entities in the States to preserve 8 Route 66 by providing technical assistance, partici-9 pating in cost-sharing programs, and making grants 10 and loans; 11 (2) act as a clearinghouse for communication 12 among Federal, State, and local agencies and private 13 persons and entities interested in the preservation of 14 Route 66; and 15 (3) assist the States in determining the appro-16 priate form of and establishing and supporting a 17 non-Federal entity or entities to perform the func-18 tions of the Preservation Office after the Preserva-19 tion Office is terminated. 20 (d) AUTHORITIES.—In carrying out this Act, the 21 Preservation Office may—
- 22 (1) enter into cooperative agreements;
- 23 (2) accept donations;
- 24 (3) provide cost-share grants;

1	(4) provide technical assistance in historic pres-
2	ervation and fundraising; and
3	(5) conduct research.
4	(e) Road Signs.—The Preservation Office shall
5	sponsor a road sign program on Route 66 to be imple-
6	mented on a cost-sharing basis with State and local orga-
7	nizations.
8	(f) Preservation Assistance.—
9	(1) In General.—The Preservation Office
10	shall provide assistance in the preservation of Route
11	66 in a manner that is compatible with the idiosyn-
12	cratic nature of the highway.
13	(2) Planning.—The Preservation Office shall
14	not prepare or require preparation of an overall
15	management plan for Route 66, but shall cooperate
16	with the States and local public and private persons
17	and entities in developing local preservation plans to
18	guide efforts to protect the most important or rep-
19	resentative resources of Route 66.
20	SEC. 4. RESOURCE TREATMENT.
21	(a) Technical Assistance Program.—
22	(1) In General.—The Preservation Office
23	shall develop a program of technical assistance in
24	the preservation of Route 66.
25	(9) Chinelines for preservation meets

- 1 (A) IN GENERAL.—As part of the program
  2 under paragraph (1), the Preservation Office
  3 shall establish guidelines for setting priorities
  4 for preservation needs.
  - (B) Basis.—The guidelines under subparagraph (A) may be based on national register standards, modified as appropriate to meet the needs of Route 66 so as to allow for the preservation of the spirit of Route 66 by including more modern resources that are integral to the evolution of the Route 66 experience.
  - (b) Program for Coordination of Activities.—
- 13 (1) IN GENERAL.—The Preservation Office 14 shall coordinate a program of historic research, 15 curation, preservation strategies, and the collection 16 of oral and video histories of Route 66.
  - (2) Design.—The program under paragraph
    (1) shall be designed for continuing use and implementation by other organizations after the Preservation Office is terminated.
- 21 (c) Cost-share Grants.—Cost-share grants for 22 preservation of Route 66 shall be available for resources 23 that meet the guidelines under subsection (a).
