## A BILL

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2       This Act may be cited as the “Merchant Marine-Rail-  
3 road Retirement Correction Act of 1998”.

4 **SEC. 2. MERCHANT MARINE SERVICE.**

5       (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 1(g)(1) of the Railroad  
6 Retirement Act of 1974 is amended by adding at the end  
7 “For the purposes of section 3(i)(2) of this Act, military  
8 service shall also be deemed to include service that is  
9 deemed to be active duty for the purposes of laws adminis-  
10 tered by the Secretary of Veterans Affairs by reason of  
11 a determination by the Secretary of Defense under section  
12 401 of Public Law 95–202 (38 U.S.C. 106 note).”.

13       (b) **EFFECTIVE DATE.**—The amendment made by  
14 this section shall apply with respect to months beginning  
15 after the date of the enactment of this Act.
