A BILL

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Drug Elimination and

5 Justice Act".

3 Section 10907 of part I of title X of the Elementary
4 and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 8247)
5 is amended by striking "appropriated" and all that follows
6 before the period and inserting the following: "appro7 priated to carry out this part—

8 "(1) such sums as may be necessary for fiscal9 year 1999; and

10 "(2) a total of \$1,000,000,000 for fiscal years
11 2000 through 2004".

12 SEC. 3. INCREASED LAW ENFORCEMENT RESOURCES IN SE13 LECTED CITIES.

14 (a) FEDERAL DRUG COURT PILOT PROGRAM. 15 There is authorized to be appropriated to the Drug Court 16 Program Office of the Office of Justice Programs of the Department of Justice, \$15,000,000 for each of fiscal 17 18 years 2000 through 2002, to carry out a pilot program to establish a Federal drug court in each of 10 cities in 19 the United States that have increasing drug enforcement 20 problems. 21

(b) INCREASED PROSECUTORIAL RESOURCES.—
There is authorized to be appropriated to the Department
of Justice, \$3,000,000 for each of fiscal years 2000
through 2002, for additional prosecutorial resources, including personnel, dedicated to drug enforcement, in each

of the 10 cities in which a Federal drug court is estab lished pursuant to subsection (a).

3 SEC. 4. INCREASED FUNDING FOR THE COPS PROGRAM.

4 Section 1001(a)(11) of part J of title I of the Omni5 bus Crime Control and Safe Streets Act of 1968 (42
6 U.S.C. 3793(a)(11)) is amended by adding at the end the
7 following:

8 "(C) In addition to amounts made available under 9 subparagraph (A), there is authorized to be appropriated 10 to carry out part Q, to remain available until expended, the total amount of \$1,500,000,000 for fiscal years 2000 11 through 2004, of which 50 percent shall be used for coop-12 13 erative partnerships between schools and State and local police departments to provide for the use of police officers 14 15 in schools.".

16 SEC. 5. INCREASED PENALTIES FOR DRUG CRIMES NEAR 17 SCHOOLS.

(2) in subsection (b)—

(A) by inserting "public library," after
 "swimming pool,"; and
 (B) by striking "three years" and inserting
 "7 years".
