A BILL

To direct the Commissioner of Social Security to establish a demonstration project to conduct outreach efforts to increase awareness of the availability of Medicare costsharing assistance to eligible low-income Medicare beneficiaries.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. FINDINGS.
- 4 Congress makes the following findings:
- 5 (1) Since 1988, three cost-sharing payment pro-
- 6 grams to provide certain low-income elderly and dis-

- abled individuals with financial assistance in covering Medicare beneficiary costs have been established by law.
 - (2) While eligibility for Medicare cost-sharing assistance has expanded, and while the Social Security Administration, the Health Care Financing Administration, and State agencies are working cooperatively to identify and implement reforms to cure the chronic deficiencies associated with the programs described in paragraph (1), reports have shown that gaps in beneficiary knowledge and deficiencies in program administration by Federal and State agencies present persistent barriers to enrolling eligible beneficiaries in such programs.
 - (3) The financial plight of Social Security and Medicare beneficiaries who experience critical income shifts due to the death of a spouse is of particular concern. Statistics furnished by the Social Security Administration show that 40 percent of nonmarried women (a category that includes widows) rely on Social Security benefits for 90 percent of their income in comparison to only 18 percent of married couples. Further, nearly one quarter of nonmarried women rely on Social Security retirement benefits as their sole source of income.

1 (4) While current reform proposals concentrate 2 on reaching potential eligible beneficiaries upon ini-3 tial enrollment in Social Security or the Medicare 4 program, the financial vulnerability of widowed 5 spouses may arise at any time after a senior has 6 begun to receive retirement benefits.

7 SEC. 2. DEMONSTRATION PROJECT.

(a) Establishment.—

- (1) Outreach.—The Commissioner shall establish a demonstration project to conduct outreach efforts to identify individuals entitled to benefits under the Medicare program who may be eligible for medical assistance for payment of the cost of Medicare cost-sharing under the Medicaid program under section 1902(a)(10)(E) and section 1933 of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 1396a(a)(10)(E); 1396u–3) and to notify such individuals of the availability of such medical assistance under such sections.
- (2) Content of Notice.—Any notice furnished under paragraph (1) shall state that eligibility for Medicare cost-sharing assistance under such sections is conditioned upon the individual providing an accurate statement as to whether or not the individual has tax-except income, and, if so, the

- 2 vidual residing in a State that imposes an asset test
- for such eligibility, the amount of countable assets
- 4 the individual has.
- 5 (b) Coordination With States and Other Fed-
- 6 ERAL AGENCIES.—
- 7 (1) Furnishing information to states.—In 8 conducting the demonstration project established 9 under subsection (a), the Commissioner shall furnish 10 the appropriate agency of each State information 11 consisting of the identity of individuals residing in 12 the State that the Commissioner determines are or 13 may be eligible for medical assistance for payment of 14 the cost of Medicare cost-sharing under the Medic-15 aid program under section 1902(a)(10)(E) and sec-16 tion 1933 of such Act, and shall periodically update 17 any such information as appropriate.
 - (2) Coordination with irs and hcfa.—Except as otherwise prohibited by law, in conducting such demonstration project the Commissioner, in cooperation with the Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service and the Administrator of the Health Care Financing Administration, shall furnish the appropriate agency of each State available income and asset information of individuals residing

- 3 (c) Duration.—The Commissioner shall conduct the
- 4 demonstration project during the 1-year period beginning
- 5 on October 1, 1998.
- 6 (d) Report.—Not later than six months after the
- 7 completion of the demonstration project, the Commis-
- 8 sioner, after consultation with the Commissioner of the In-
- 9 ternal Revenue Service and the Administrator of the
- 10 Health Care Financing Administration, shall submit to
- 11 Congress a report on the outreach efforts and results of
- 12 such efforts under the project. The report may include any
- 13 recommendations for legislative or administrative actions
- 14 to further carry out the purpose of the project.
- (e) Definitions.—In this Act:
- 16 (1) Commissioner.—The term "Commis-
- sioner" means the Commissioner of Social Security.
- 18 (2) Medicaid Program.—The term "Medicaid
- 19 program" means the program of medical assistance
- 20 established under title XIX of the Social Security
- 21 Act (42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.).
- 22 (3) Medicare program.—The term "Medicare
- program" means the health insurance program es-
- tablished under title XVIII of such Act (42 U.S.C.
- 25 1395 et seq.).

- 1 (f) Authorization of Appropriations.—From
- 2 sums made available to the Social Security Administration
- 3 for fiscal year 1999 to carry out research and demonstra-
- 4 tions activities, not more than \$5,000,000 may be obli-
- 5 gated to carry out the demonstration project under this

6 Act.
