1 SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-

- 2 **DRED FIFTH CONGRESS.**
- 3 (a) In General.—With respect to the One Hundred
- 4 Fifth Congress, there shall be paid out of the applicable ac-
- 5 counts of the House of Representatives, in accordance with
- 6 this primary expense resolution, not more than the amount
- 7 specified in subsection (b) for the expenses (including the
- 8 expenses of all staff salaries) of each committee named in
- 9 that subsection.

- 5 ner directed by the Committee on House Oversight.

6 SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.

- 7 Amounts made available under this resolution shall be
- 8 expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by the
- 9 Committee on House Oversight.

10 SEC. 6. ADJUSTMENT AUTHORITY.

- 11 The Committee on House Oversight shall have author-
- 12 ity to make adjustments in amounts under section 1, if nec-
- 13 essary to comply with an order of the President issued
- 14 under section 254 of the Balanced Budget and Emergency
- 15 Deficit Control Act of 1985 or to conform to any reduction
- 16 in appropriations for the purposes of such section 1.

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
