Mr. GEPHARDT (for himself, Mr. ENGEL, and Mr. PASCRELL) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on International Relations

RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of Congress that the United States should support Italy's inclusion as a permanent member of the United Nations Security Council if there is to be an expansion of this important international body.
- Whereas Italy organized and led a multi-national peace enforcement operation in Albania last spring under United Nations authority to restore order and organize democratic elections;
- Whereas Italy provided the second largest United Nations troop contingent in Somalia;
- Whereas in 1983 Italy joined the United States in a multilateral force to bring peace and stability to Lebanon and

Italy still participates in the ongoing U.N. peacekeeping force in Lebanon;

- Whereas Italy brokered the peace settlement in Mozambique and led the peacekeeping force that implemented it;
- Whereas Italy hosts at Brindisi the sole United Nations logistical base supporting peacekeeping operations worldwide;
- Whereas Italy's strategic location in the Mediterranean makes it an indispensable partner in security operations in multiple zones of instability;
- Whereas Italy hosts airbases from which the United States and its NATO partners have conducted air operations over the former Yugoslavia;
- Whereas Italy is the world's fifth largest economy and next year becomes the U.N.'s fifth largest assessed contributor;
- Whereas Italy's contribution to the U.N. is greater than that of Britain, Russia and China, three permanent members of the Security Council;
- Whereas President Clinton stated, "Italy has been and continues to be one of our closest allies and strategic partners in the world community; and
- Whereas the U.S. State Department has been actively supporting a reorganization plan that would give Germany and Japan permanent seats on the United Nations Security Council, to the exclusion of Italy: Now, therefore, be it
- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives, That the
- 2 Congress—

(1) urges the President to oppose any reorga nization plan for the expansion of the Security
Council which does not include Italy;

(2) urges the President to support Italy's inclu-4 5 sion as a permanent member if there is to be an expansion of the United Nations Security Council; and 6 (3) urges the State Department to develop a re-7 organization plan of the United Nations Security 8 9 Council that would incorporate nations that have played a significant role in fostering world peace and 10 11 stability such as Italy.
