# RESOLUTION

- Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding assistance to Mexico to combat wildfires, and for other purposes.
- Whereas fires in Mexico and Central America have burned over 1,000,000 acres in recent weeks;
- Whereas the severe drought causing the fires shows no signs of ending;
- Whereas smoke from these fires has spread to the United States, and the pollution caused by the smoke will likely lead to an increased incidence of respiratory health problems;

- Whereas the United States has a Cooperative Fire Suppression Agreement with Canada to address the issue of fires occurring along the border between the two countries;
- Whereas in the past fires starting in Mexico have grown out of control and have spread into the United States; and
- Whereas both the United States Forest Service and the Mexican Forest Service have expressed an interest in having a cooperative fire suppression agreement between the United States and Mexico: Now, therefore, be it

# 2 SECTION 1. SENSE OF THE HOUSE REGARDING ASSIST-3 ANCE TO MEXICO TO COMBAT WILDFIRES.

4 It is the sense of the House of Representatives that 5 the President of the United States should provide, from 6 funds available for such purposes, the necessary assistance 7 to Mexico, including disaster relief assistance, to extin-8 guish the wildfires currently burning in Mexico and Cen-9 tral America.

### 10 SEC. 2. SENSE OF THE HOUSE REGARDING A COOPERATIVE

11FIRE SUPPRESSION AGREEMENT WITH MEX-12ICO.

13 It is further the sense of the House of Representa-14 tives that the United States should initiate negotiations 15 with Mexico at the earliest date possible in order to come 16 to a mutually beneficial agreement as soon as possible ad1 dressing the concerns of both countries in suppressing

2 fires occurring along the border between the two countries.
