# RESOLUTION

Providing amounts for the expenses of certain committees  
of the House of Representatives in the One Hundred  
Fifth Congress.

1       *Resolved,*

2       **SECTION 1. COMMITTEE EXPENSES FOR THE ONE HUN-**  
3                               **DRED FIFTH CONGRESS.**

4           (a) IN GENERAL.—With respect to the One Hundred  
5 Fifth Congress, there shall be paid out of the applicable  
6 accounts of the House of Representatives, in accordance  
7 with this primary expense resolution, not more than the  
8 amount specified in subsection (b) for the expenses (in-  
9 cluding the expenses of all staff salaries) of each commit-  
10 tee named in that subsection.

1 (b) COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.—The committees  
2 and amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee  
3 on Agriculture, \$7,792,162.00; Committee on Banking  
4 and Financial Services, \$9,414,784.53; Committee on the  
5 Budget, \$9,940,000; Committee on Commerce,  
6 \$14,671,538; Committee on Education and the Workforce,  
7 \$10,569,157; Committee on Government Reform and  
8 Oversight, \$20,020,572; Committee on House Oversight,  
9 \$6,160,946; Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence,  
10 \$4,939,526.00; Committee on International Relations,  
11 \$11,150,892; Committee on the Judiciary, \$12,037,046;  
12 Committee on National Security, \$10,668,640; Committee  
13 on Resources, \$10,418,537; Committee on Rules,  
14 \$4,649,102; Committee on Science, \$9,128,727.44; Com-  
15 mittee on Small Business, \$4,099,817; Committee on  
16 Standards of Official Conduct, \$2,439,300; Committee on  
17 Transportation and Infrastructure, \$14,096,282; Commit-

19 Ways and Means, \$11,163,529.

20 **SEC. 2. FIRST SESSION LIMITATIONS.**

21 (a) IN GENERAL.—Of the amount provided for in  
22 section 1 for each committee named in subsection (b), not  
23 more than the amount specified in such subsection shall

1 be available for expenses incurred during the period begin-  
2 ning at noon on January 3, 1997, and ending immediately  
3 before noon on January 3, 1998.

4 (b) COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.—The committees  
5 and amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee  
6 on Agriculture, \$3,851,039.00; Committee on Banking  
7 and Financial Services, \$4,568,817.48; Committee on the  
8 Budget, \$4,970,000; Committee on Commerce,

10 \$5,227,342; Committee on Government Reform and Over-  
11 sight, \$11,702,573; Committee on House Oversight,  
12 \$3,133,200; Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence,  
13 \$2,420,040.00; Committee on International Relations,  
14 \$5,433,555; Committee on the Judiciary, \$5,732,403;  
15 Committee on National Security, \$5,145,928; Committee

23 **SEC. 3. SECOND SESSION LIMITATIONS.**

24 (a) IN GENERAL.—Of the amount provided for in  
25 section 1 for each committee named in subsection (b), not

1 more than the amount specified in such subsection shall  
2 be available for expenses incurred during the period begin-  
3 ning at noon on January 3, 1998, and ending immediately  
4 before noon on January 3, 1999.

5 (b) COMMITTEES AND AMOUNTS.—The committees  
6 and amounts referred to in subsection (a) are: Committee  
7 on Agriculture, \$3,941,123.00; Committee on Banking  
8 and Financial Services, \$4,845,967.05; Committee on the  
9 Budget, \$4,970,000; Committee on Commerce,  
10 \$7,492,098; Committee on Education and the Workforce,  
11 \$5,341,815; Committee on Government Reform and Over-  
12 sight, \$8,317,999; Committee on House Oversight,  
13 \$3,027,746; Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence,  
14 \$2,519,486.00; Committee on International Relations,  
15 \$5,717,337; Committee on the Judiciary, \$6,304,643;  
16 Committee on National Security, \$5,522,712; Committee  
17 on Resources, \$5,360,013; Committee on Rules,  
18 \$2,342,695; Committee on Science, \$4,609,555.44; Com-  
19 mittee on Small Business, \$2,084,999; Committee on  
20 Standards of Official Conduct, \$1,202,000; Committee on  
21 Transportation and Infrastructure, \$7,053,557; Commit-  
22 tee on Veterans' Affairs, \$2,999,902; and Committee on  
23 Ways and Means, \$5,690,907.

1 **SEC. 4. VOUCHERS.**

2       Payments under this resolution shall be made on  
3 vouchers authorized by the committee involved, signed by  
4 the chairman of such committee, and approved in the  
5 manner directed by the Committee on House Oversight.

6 **SEC. 5. REGULATIONS.**

7       Amounts made available under this resolution shall  
8 be expended in accordance with regulations prescribed by  
9 the Committee on House Oversight.

10 **SEC. 6. RESERVE FUND FOR UNANTICIPATED EXPENSES.**

11       There is hereby established a reserve fund for unan-  
12 ticipated expenses of committees for the One Hundred  
13 Fifth Congress. Amounts in the fund shall be paid to a  
14 committee pursuant to an allocation approved by the Com-  
15 mittee on House Oversight.
