5 (a) REQUEST FOR IAEA REPORTS.—The Secretary of State shall direct the United States representative to 6 7 the International Atomic Energy Agency to request the 8 Director-General of the Agency to submit to the United 9 States all reports prepared with respect to all programs 10 or projects of the Agency that are of concern to the United States, including the programs or projects described in 11 section 3. 12

13 (b) ANNUAL REPORTS TO CONGRESS.—Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment of this Act, 14 15 and on an annual basis thereafter, the Secretary, in consultation with the United States representative to the 16 International Atomic Energy Agency, shall prepare and 17 18 submit to Congress a report containing a description of 19 all programs or projects of the Agency in each country referred to in section 307(a) of the Foreign Assistance Act 20 21 of 1961 (22 U.S.C. 2227(a)).
