Mr. GRASSLEY (for himself, Mr. DURBIN, Mr. HATCH, Mr. DEWINE, Mr. HAGEL, and Mr. WARNER) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

A BILL

To extend certain temporary judgeships in the Federal judiciary.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. EXTENSION OF CERTAIN TEMPORARY JUDGE-**
4 **SHIPS.**

5 Section 203(c) of the Judicial Improvements Act of
6 1990 (Public Law 101–650; 104 Stat. 5101; 28 U.S.C.
7 133 note), as amended by Public Law 104–60 (109 Stat.
8 635; 28 U.S.C. 133 note), is amended—

9 (1) by striking paragraph (1); and

1 (2) by striking the last 2 sentences and insert-
2 ing “Except with respect to the western district of
3 Michigan and the eastern district of Pennsylvania,
4 the first vacancy in the office of district judge in
5 each of the judicial districts named in this sub-
6 section, occurring 10 years or more after the con-
7 firmation date of the judge named to fill the tem-
8 porary judgeship created by this subsection, shall
9 not be filled. The first vacancy in the office of dis-
10 trict judge in the western district of Michigan, oc-
11 curring after December 1, 1995, shall not be filled.
12 The first vacancy in the office of district judge in
13 the eastern district of Pennsylvania, occurring 5
14 years or more after the confirmation date of the
15 judge named to fill the temporary judgeship created
16 for such district under this subsection, shall not be
17 filled.”.
