## A BILL

- To make the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 applicable to the United States Postal Service in the same manner as any other employer.

  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Postal Employees5 Safety Enhancement Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. APPLICATION OF ACT.

7 (a) DEFINITION.—Section 3(5) of the Occupational
8 Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 652(5)) is
9 amended by inserting after "the United States" the fol-

 lowing: "(not including the United States Postal Serv-2 ice)".

3 (b) Federal Programs.—

4	(1) Occupational safety and health.—
5	Section 19(a) of the Occupational Safety and Health
6	Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 668(a)) is amended by in-
7	serting after "each Federal Agency" the following:
8	"(not including the United States Postal Service)".
9	(2) OTHER SAFETY PROGRAMS.—Section
10	7902(a)(2) of title 5, United States Code, is amend-
11	ed by inserting after "Government of the United
12	States" the following: "(not including the United
13	States Postal Service)".
14	SEC. 3. CLOSING OR CONSOLIDATION OF OFFICES NOT
15	BASED ON OSHA COMPLIANCE.
16	Section 404(b)(2) of title 39, United States Code, is
17	amended to read as follows:

18 "(2) The Postal Service, in making a determination19 whether or not to close or consolidate a post office—

20 "(A) shall consider—

21 "(i) the effect of such closing or consolida22 tion on the community served by such post of23 fice;

1	"(ii) the effect of such closing or consolida-
2	tion on employees of the Postal Service em-
3	ployed at such office;
4	"(iii) whether such closing or consolidation
5	is consistent with the policy of the Government,
6	as stated in section 101(b) of this title, that the
7	Postal Service shall provide a maximum degree
8	of effective and regular postal services to rural
9	areas, communities, and small towns where post
10	offices are not self-sustaining;
11	"(iv) the economic savings to the Postal
12	Service resulting from such closing or consolida-
13	tion; and
14	"(v) such other factors as the Postal Serv-
15	ice determines are necessary; and
16	"(B) may not consider compliance with any
17	provision of the Occupational Safety and Health Act
18	of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 651 et seq.).".
19	SEC. 4. PROHIBITION ON RESTRICTION OR ELIMINATION
20	OF SERVICES.
21	(a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 4 of title 39, United
22	States Code, is amended by adding after section 414 the
23	following:

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3 "The Postal Service may not restrict, eliminate, or
4 adversely affect any service provided by the Postal Service
5 as a result of the payment of any penalty imposed under
6 the Occupational Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29
7 U.S.C. 651 et seq.).".

8 (b) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENT.—
9 The table of sections for chapter 4 of title 39, United
10 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the follow11 ing:

"415. Prohibition on restriction or elimination of services.".

### 12 SEC. 5. LIMITATIONS ON RAISE IN RATES.

13 Section 3622 of title 39, United States Code, is14 amended by adding at the end the following:

15 "(c) Compliance with any provision of the Occupa-16 tional Safety and Health Act of 1970 (29 U.S.C. 651 et 17 seq.) shall not be considered by the Commission in deter-18 mining whether to increase rates and shall not otherwise 19 affect the service of the Postal Service.".
