A BILL

- To amend sections 3345 through 3349 of title 5, United States Code (commonly referred to as the "Vacancies Act") to clarify statutory requirements relating to vacancies in and appointments to certain Federal offices, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Vacancies Re-
- 5 form Act of 1998".

1 SEC. 2. FEDERAL VACANCIES AND APPOINTMENTS.

2 (a) IN GENERAL.—Chapter 33 of title 5, United
3 States Code, is amended by striking sections 3345 through
4 3349 and inserting the following:

5 "§ 3345. Acting officer

6 "(a) If an officer of an Executive agency (including 7 the Executive Office of the President, and other than the 8 General Accounting Office) whose appointment to office 9 is required to be made by the President, by and with the 10 advice and consent of the Senate, dies, resigns, or is other-11 wise unable to perform the functions and duties of the of-12 fice—

"(1) the first assistant of such officer shall perform the functions and duties of the office temporarily in an acting capacity, subject to the time limitations of section 3346; or

"(2) notwithstanding paragraph (1), the Presi-17 18 dent (and only the President) may direct a person 19 who serves in an office for which appointment is re-20 quired to be made by the President, by and with the 21 advice and consent of the Senate, to perform the 22 functions and duties of the office temporarily in an 23 acting capacity, subject to the time limitations of 24 section 3346.

"(b) Notwithstanding section 3346(a)(2), a person
 may not serve as an acting officer for an office under this
 section, if—

4 "(1) on the date of the death, resignation, or
5 beginning of inability to serve of the applicable offi6 cer, such person serves in the position of first assist7 ant to such officer;

8 "(2) during the 365-day period preceding such 9 date, such person served in the position of first as-10 sistant to such officer for less than 180 days; and 11 "(3) the President submits a nomination of 12 such person to the Senate for appointment to such 13 office.

14 "(c) With respect to the office of the Attorney Gen-15 eral of the United States, the provisions of section 50816 of title 28 shall be applicable.

17 **"§ 3346. Time limitation**

18 "(a) The person serving as an acting officer as de-19 scribed under section 3345 may serve in the office—

20 "(1) for no longer than 150 days beginning on21 the date the vacancy occurs; or

"(2) subject to subsection (b), once a first or
second nomination for the office is submitted to the
Senate, for the period that the nomination is pending in the Senate.

"(b)(1) If the first nomination for the office is rejected by the Senate, withdrawn, or returned to the President by the Senate, the person may continue to serve as
the acting officer for no more than 150 days after the
date of such rejection, withdrawal, or return.

6 "(2) If a second nomination for the office (of a dif-7 ferent person than first nominated in the case of a rejec-8 tion or withdrawal) is submitted to the Senate during the 9 150-day period after the rejection, withdrawal, or return 10 of the first nomination, the person serving as the acting 11 officer may continue to serve—

12 "(A) until the second nomination is confirmed;13 or

"(B) for no more than 150 days after the second nomination is rejected, withdrawn, or returned.
"(c) If a person begins serving as an acting officer
during an adjournment of the Congress sine die, the 150day period under subsection (a) shall begin on the date
that the Senate first reconvenes.

20 "§ 3347. Application

"(a) Sections 3345 and 3346 are applicable to any
office of an Executive agency (including the Executive Office of the President, and other than the General Accounting Office) for which appointment is required to be made

1 by the President, by and with the advice and consent of2 the Senate, unless—

- 3 "(1) another statutory provision expressly pro4 vides that such provision supersedes sections 3345
 5 and 3346;
- 6 "(2) a statutory provision in effect on the date 7 of enactment of the Federal Vacancies Reform Act 8 of 1998 expressly authorizes the President, or the 9 head of an Executive department, to designate an 10 officer to perform the functions and duties of a spec-11 ified office temporarily in an acting capacity; or
- "(3) the President makes an appointment to fill
 a vacancy in such office during the recess of the
 Senate pursuant to clause 3 of section 2 of article
 II of the United States Constitution.
- "(b) Any statutory provision providing general authority to the head of an Executive agency (including the
 Executive Office of the President, and other than the General Accounting Office) to delegate duties to, or to reassign duties among, officers or employees of such Executive
 agency, is not a statutory provision to which subsection
 (a)(2) applies.

23 **"§ 3348. Vacant office**

24 "(a) In this section—

1	"(1) the term 'action' includes any agency ac-
2	tion as defined under section $551(13)$; and
3	"(2) the term 'function or duty' means any
4	function or duty of the applicable office that—
5	"(A)(i) is established by statute; and
6	"(ii) is required by statute to be performed
7	by the applicable officer (and only that officer);
8	Or
9	((B)(i)(I)) is established by regulation; and
10	"(II) is required by such regulation to be
11	performed by the applicable officer (and only
12	that officer); and
13	"(ii) includes a function or duty to which
14	clause (i) (I) and (II) applies, and the applica-
15	ble regulation is in effect at any time during
16	the 180-day period preceding the date on which
17	the vacancy occurs, notwithstanding any regula-
18	tion that—
19	"(I) is issued on or after the date oc-
20	curring 180 days before the date on which
21	the vacancy occurs; and
22	"(II) limits any function or duty re-
23	quired to be performed by the applicable
24	officer (and only that officer).
25	"(b) Subject to section 3347 and subsection (c)—

1 "(1) if the President does not submit a first 2 nomination to the Senate to fill a vacant office with-3 in 150 days after the date on which a vacancy oc-4 curs-"(A) the office shall remain vacant until 5 6 the President submits a first nomination to the 7 Senate; and "(B) in the case of an office other than the 8 9 office of the head of an Executive agency (including the Executive Office of the President, 10 11 and other than the General Accounting Office), 12 only the head of such Executive agency may 13 perform any function or duty of such office, 14 until a nomination is made in accordance with 15 subparagraph (A); "(2) if the President does not submit a second 16 17 nomination to the Senate within 150 days after the 18 date of the rejection, withdrawal, or return of the 19 first nomination— 20 "(A) the office shall remain vacant until 21 the President submits a second nomination to 22 the Senate; and 23 "(B) in the case of an office other than the 24 office of the head of an Executive agency (in-25 cluding the Executive Office of the President,

1	and other than the General Accounting Office),
2	only the head of such Executive agency may
3	perform any function or duty of such office,
4	until a nomination is made in accordance with
5	subparagraph (A); and
6	"(3) if an office is vacant after 150 days after
7	the rejection, withdrawal, or return of the second
8	nomination—
9	"(A) the office shall remain vacant until a
10	person is appointed by the President, by and
11	with the advice and consent of the Senate; and
12	"(B) in the case of an office other than the
13	office of the head of an Executive agency (in-
14	cluding the Executive Office of the President,
15	and other than the General Accounting Office),
16	only the head of such Executive agency may
17	perform any function or duty of such office,
18	until an appointment is made in accordance
19	with subparagraph (A).
20	"(c) If the last day of any 150-day period under sub-
21	section (b) is a day on which the Senate is not in session,
22	the first day the Senate is next in session and receiving
23	nominations shall be deemed to be the last day of such
24	period.

1	"(d)(1) Except as provided under paragraphs (1)(B),
2	(2)(B), and $(3)(B)$ of subsection (b), an action shall have
3	no force or effect if such action—
4	"(A)(i) is taken by any person who fills a va-
5	cancy in violation of subsection (b); and
б	"(ii) is the performance of a function or duty
7	of such vacant office; or
8	"(B)(i) is taken by a person who is not filling
9	a vacant office; and
10	"(ii) is the performance of a function or duty
11	of such vacant office.
12	((2) An action that has no force or effect under para-
13	graph (1) may not be ratified.
14	"(d) This section shall not apply to—
15	"(1) the General Counsel of the National Labor
16	Relations Board;
17	"(2) the General Counsel of the Federal Labor
18	Relations Authority; or
19	"(3) any Inspector General appointed by the
20	President, by and with the advice and consent of the
21	Senate.
22	"§3349. Reporting of vacancies
23	"(a) The head of each Executive agency (including
24	the Executive Office of the President, and other than the
25	General Accounting Office) shall submit to the Comptrol-

ler General of the United States and to each House of
 Congress—

3 "(1) notification of a vacancy and the date such
4 vacancy occurred immediately upon the occurrence
5 of the vacancy;

6 "(2) the name of any person serving in an act7 ing capacity and the date such service began imme8 diately upon the designation;

9 "(3) the name of any person nominated to the 10 Senate to fill the vacancy and the date such nomina-11 tion is submitted immediately upon the submission 12 of the nomination; and

13 "(4) the date of a rejection, withdrawal, or re14 turn of any nomination immediately upon such rejec15 tion, withdrawal, or return.

"(b) If the Comptroller General of the United States
makes a determination that an officer is serving longer
than the 150-day period including the applicable exceptions to such period under section 3346, the Comptroller
General shall report such determination to—

21 "(1) the Committee on Governmental Affairs of22 the Senate;

23 "(2) the Committee on Government Reform and
24 Oversight of the House of Representatives;

1	"(3) the Committees on Appropriations of the
2	Senate and House of Representatives;
3	"(4) the appropriate committees of jurisdiction
4	of the Senate and House of Representatives;
5	"(5) the President; and
6	"(6) the Office of Personnel Management.
7	"§3349a. Presidential inaugural transitions
8	"(a) In this section, the term 'transitional inaugura-
9	tion day' means the date on which any person swears or
10	affirms the oath of office as President, if such person is
11	not the President on the date preceding the date of swear-
12	ing or affirming such oath of office.
13	"(b) With respect to any vacancy that exists during
14	the 60-day period beginning on a transitional inauguration
15	day, the 150-day period under section 3346 or 3348 shall
16	be deemed to—
17	"(1) begin on the later of—
18	"(A) the date following such transitional
19	inauguration day; or
20	"(B) the date the vacancy occurs; and
21	"(2) be a period of 180 days.
22	"§3349b. Holdover provisions relating to certain
23	independent establishments
24	"With respect to any independent establishment for
25	which a single officer is the head of the establishment,

sections 3345 through 3349a shall not be construed to af-1 2 fect any statute that authorizes a person to continue to 3 serve in any office— ((1)) after the expiration of the term for which 4 5 such person is appointed; and 6 "(2) until a successor is appointed or a speci-7 fied period of time has expired. 8 "§ 3349c. Exclusion of certain officers 9 "Sections 3345 through 3349b shall not apply to— 10 "(1) any member who is appointed by the 11 President, by and with the advice and consent of the 12 Senate to any board, commission, or similar entity 13 that— "(A) is composed of multiple members; and 14 "(B) governs an independent establishment 15 16 or Government corporation; or 17 "(2) any commissioner of the Federal Energy 18 Regulatory Commission.". 19 (b) TECHNICAL AND CONFORMING AMENDMENT.— 20 (1) TABLE OF SECTIONS.—The table of sections 21 for chapter 33 of title 5, United States Code, is 22 amended by striking the matter relating to sub-23 chapter III and inserting the following: "SUBCHAPTER III-DETAILS, VACANCIES, AND APPOINTMENTS "3341. "3349b. Holdover provisions relating to certain independent establishments. "3349c. Exclusion of certain officers.".

(2) SUBCHAPTER HEADING.—The subchapter
 heading for subchapter III of chapter 33 of title 5,
 United States Code, is amended to read as follows:
 "SUBCHAPTER III—DETAILS, VACANCIES, AND
 APPOINTMENTS".

6 SEC. 3. EFFECTIVE DATE AND APPLICATION.

7 (a) EFFECTIVE DATE.—This Act and the amend8 ments made by this Act shall take effect on the date of
9 enactment of this Act.

10 (b) APPLICATION.—This Act shall apply to any office11 that—

12 (1) becomes vacant after the date of enactment13 of this Act; or

(2) is vacant on such date, except sections 3345
through 3349 of title 5, United States Code (as
amended by this Act), shall apply as though such office first became vacant on such date.

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
