AN ACT

To establish the Minuteman Missile National Historic Site in the State of South Dakota, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Minuteman Missile Na-
- 5 tional Historic Site Establishment Act of 1998".

SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

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2 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

3 (1) the Minuteman II intercontinental ballistic
4 missile (hereinafter referred to as "ICBM") launch
5 control facility and launch facility known as "Delta
6 1" and "Delta 9", respectively, have national signifi7 cance as the best preserved examples of the oper8 ational character of American history during the
9 Cold War;

10 (2) the facilities are symbolic of the dedication
11 and preparedness exhibited by the missileers of the
12 Air Force stationed throughout the upper Great
13 Plains in remote and forbidding locations during the
14 Cold War;

(3) the facilities provide a unique opportunity
to illustrate the history and significance of the Cold
War, the arms race, and ICBM development; and

18 (4) the National Park System does not contain
19 a unit that specifically commemorates or interprets
20 the Cold War.

21 (b) PURPOSES.—The purposes of this Act are—

(1) to preserve, protect, and interpret for the
benefit and enjoyment of present and future generations the structures associated with the Minuteman
II missile defense system;

3 ret the

1 (2) to interpret the historical role of the Min-2 uteman II missile defense system in the broader con-3 text of the Cold War and the role of the system as 4 a key component of America's strategic commitment 5 to preserve world peace; and 6 (3) to complement the interpretive programs re-7 lating to the Minuteman II missile defense system 8 offered by the South Dakota Air and Space Museum 9 at Ellsworth Air Force Base. 10 SEC. 3. MINUTEMAN MISSILE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE. (a) ESTABLISHMENT.—(1) The Minuteman Missile 11 12 National Historic Site in the State of South Dakota (hereinafter referred to as the "historic site") is hereby estab-13 14 lished as a unit of the National Park System. The historic 15 site shall consist of lands and interests therein comprising the following Minuteman II ICBM launch control facili-16 17 ties, as generally depicted on the map referred to as "Minuteman Missile National Historic Site", numbered 406/ 18 19 80,008 and dated September, 1998: 20(A) An area surrounding the Minuteman II 21 ICBM launch control facility depicted as "Delta 1 22 Launch Control Facility". 23 (B) An area surrounding the Minuteman II 24 ICBM launch control facility depicted as "Delta 9

25 Launch Facility".

(2) The map described in paragraph (1) shall be on
 file and available for public inspection in the appropriate
 offices of the National Park Service.

4 (3) The Secretary of the Interior (hereinafter re5 ferred to as the "Secretary") is authorized to make minor
6 adjustments to the boundary of the historic site.

7 (b) ADMINISTRATION OF HISTORIC SITE.—The Sec8 retary shall administer the historic site in accordance with
9 this Act and laws generally applicable to units of the Na10 tional Park System, including the Act of August 25, 1916
11 (16 U.S.C. 1, 2–4) and the Act of August 21, 1935 (16
12 U.S.C. 461–467).

(c) COORDINATION WITH SECRETARY OF DE14 FENSE.—The Secretary shall consult with the Secretary
15 of Defense and the Secretary of State, as appropriate, to
16 ensure that administration of the historic site is in compli17 ance with applicable treaties.

(d) COOPERATIVE AGREEMENTS.—The Secretary
may enter into cooperative agreements with appropriate
public and private entities and individuals in furtherance
of the purposes of this Act.

(e) LAND ACQUISITION.—(1) Except as provided in
paragraph (2), the Secretary is authorized to acquire
lands and interests therein within the boundaries of the
historic site by donation, purchase with donated or appro-

priated funds, exchange or transfer from another Federal
 agency: *Provided*, That lands or interests therein owned
 by the State of South Dakota may only be acquired by
 donation or exchange.

5 (2) The Secretary shall not acquire any lands pursuant to this Act if the Secretary determines that such lands, 6 7 or any portion thereof, are contaminated with hazardous 8 substances (as defined in the Comprehensive Environ-9 mental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (42) 10 U.S.C. 9601)), unless all remedial action necessary to protect human health and the environment has been taken 11 pursuant to such Act. 12

(f) GENERAL MANAGEMENT PLAN.—(1) Within
three years after the date funds are made available, the
Secretary shall prepare a general management plan for the
historic site.

17 (2) The plan shall include an evaluation of an appropriate location for a visitor facility and administrative site 18 within the areas depicted as "Support Facility Study 19 Area—Alternative A" or "Support Facility Study Area— 20 Alternative B" on the map referred to in subsection (a). 21 22 Upon a determination by the Secretary of the appropriate 23 location for such facilities, the boundaries of the historic 24 site shall be modified to include the selected site.

(3) In developing the plan, the Secretary shall con sider coordinating or consolidating appropriate adminis trative, management, and personnel functions with Bad lands National Park.

5 SEC. 4. AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.

6 (a) IN GENERAL.—There is authorized to be appro7 priated such sums as may be necessary to carry out this
8 Act.

9 (b) AIR FORCE FUNDS.—The Secretary of the Air 10 Force shall transfer to the Secretary any funds specifically 11 appropriated to the Air Force for the maintenance, protec-12 tion, or preservation of the facilities described in section 13 3. Such funds shall be used by the Secretary for establish-14 ing, operating, and maintaining the historic site.

(c) LEGACY RESOURCE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM.—
16 Nothing in this Act affects the use of any funds available
17 for the Legacy Resource Management Program being car18 ried out by the Air Force that, before the date of enact19 ment of this Act, were directed to be used for resource
20 preservation and treaty compliance.
