# A BILL

- To authorize the Secretary of the Interior to enter into an agreement for the construction and operation of the Gateway Visitor Center at Independence National Historical Park.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Gateway Visitor Center

5 Authorization Act of 1998".

### 6 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

7 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

(1) in 1997, the National Park Service com pleted a general management plan for Independence
 National Historical Park that establishes goals and
 priorities for the future of the park;

5 (2) the plan calls for the revitalization of Inde6 pendence Mall and recommends as a critical compo7 nent of the revitalization the development of a new
8 visitor center;

9 (3) such a visitor center would replace the exist-10 ing park visitor center and serve as an orientation 11 center for visitors to the park and to city and re-12 gional attractions;

(4) after completing of the general management
plan, the National Park Service completed a design
project and master plan for Independence Mall that
includes the Gateway Visitor Center;

(5) plans for the Gateway Visitor Center call
for the center to be developed and managed, in cooperation with the Secretary of the Interior, by a
nonprofit organization that represents the various
public and civic interests of the Philadelphia metropolitan area; and

(6) the Gateway Visitor Center Corporation, a
nonprofit organization, has been established to raise
funds for and cooperate in a program to design, de-

velop, construct, and operate the proposed Gateway
 Visitor Center.

3 (b) PURPOSE.—The purpose of this Act is to author4 ize the Secretary of the Interior to enter into an agree5 ment with the Gateway Visitor Center Corporation to con6 struct and operate a regional visitor center on Independ7 ence Mall in cooperation with the Secretary.

#### 8 SEC. 3. GATEWAY VISITOR CENTER.

9 The Act of June 28, 1948 (16 U.S.C. 407m et seq.)
10 is amended by adding at the end the following:

## 11 "SEC. 8. REGIONAL GATEWAY VISITOR CENTER.

12 "(a) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

13 "(1) CENTER.—The term 'Center' means the
14 Gateway Visitor Center authorized by subsection (b).

15 "(2) CORPORATION.—The term 'Corporation'
16 means Gateway Visitor Center Corporation, a non17 profit organization.

18 "(b) AGREEMENT.—The Secretary of the Interior
19 may enter into an agreement under appropriate terms and
20 conditions with the Corporation to facilitate the construc21 tion and operation of the Gateway Visitor Center on Inde22 pendence Mall.

23 "(c) AUTHORIZED ACTIVITIES.—The agreement
24 under subsection (b) shall—

25 "(1) authorize the Corporation—

"(A) to operate the Center in cooperation 1 2 with the Secretary and provide at the Center 3 information, interpretation, facilities, and serv-4 ices to visitors of Independence National His-5 torical Park, its surrounding historic sites, the 6 city of Philadelphia, and the region, in order to 7 assist in the enjoyment of the historic, cultural, 8 educational, and recreational resources of the 9 Philadelphia metropolitan area; and 10 "(B) to engage in activities appropriate for 11 operation of a regional visitor center, which 12 may include selling food, charging fees, con-13 ducting events, and selling merchandise and 14 tickets to visitors to the Center; and "(2) authorize the Secretary to undertake at 15 16 the Center activities relating to the management of 17 Independence National Historical Park, including 18 provision of appropriate visitor information and in-19 terpretive facilities and programs related to the

20 park.

21 "(d) REVENUES.—Revenues from the operation
22 of the Center's facilities and services shall be used
23 to pay for expenses of operation.

24 "(e) PRESERVATION AND PROTECTION.—Noth-25 ing in this section authorizes the Secretary or the

Corporation to take any action in derogation of the
 preservation and protection of the values and re sources of Independence National Historical Park.".
