A BILL

To improve the National Wildlife Refuge System, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "National Wildlife Ref-
- 5 uge System Improvement Act of 1998".
- 6 SEC. 2. UPPER MISSISSIPPI RIVER NATIONAL WILDLIFE
- 7 AND FISH REFUGE.
- 8 (a) In General.—In accordance with section
- 9 4(a)(3) of the National Wildlife Refuge System Adminis-
- 10 tration Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 668dd(a)(3)), there are
- 11 transferred to the Corps of Engineers, without reimburse-

- 1 ment, approximately 37.36 acres of land of the Upper Mis-
- 2 sissippi River Wildlife and Fish Refuge in the State of
- 3 Minnesota, as designated on the map entitled "Upper Mis-
- 4 sissippi National Wildlife and Fish Refuge lands trans-
- 5 ferred to Corps of Engineers", dated January 1998, and
- 6 available, with accompanying legal descriptions of the
- 7 land, for inspection in appropriate offices of the United
- 8 States Fish and Wildlife Service.
- 9 (b) Conforming Amendments.—The first section
- 10 and section 2 of the Upper Mississippi River Wild Life
- 11 and Fish Refuge Act (16 U.S.C. 721, 722) are amended
- 12 by striking "Upper Mississippi River Wild Life and Fish
- 13 Refuge" each place it appears and inserting "Upper Mis-
- 14 sissippi River National Wildlife and Fish Refuge".

15 SEC. 3. KILLCOHOOK COORDINATION AREA.

- 16 (a) In General.—In accordance with section
- 17 4(a)(3) of the National Wildlife Refuge System Adminis-
- 18 tration Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 668dd(a)(3)), the jurisdic-
- 19 tion of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service over
- 20 approximately 1,439.26 acres of land in the States of New
- 21 Jersey and Delaware, known as the "Killcohook Coordina-
- 22 tion Area", as established by Executive Order No. 6582,
- 23 issued February 3, 1934, and Executive Order No. 8648,
- 24 issued January 23, 1941, is terminated.

- 1 (b) EXECUTIVE ORDERS.—Executive Order No.
- 2 6582, issued February 3, 1934, and Executive Order No.
- 3 8648, issued January 23, 1941, are revoked.
- 4 SEC. 4. LAKE ELSIE NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE.
- 5 (a) In General.—In accordance with section
- 6 4(a)(3) of the National Wildlife Refuge System Adminis-
- 7 tration Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 668dd(a)(3)), the jurisdic-
- 8 tion of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service over
- 9 approximately 634.7 acres of land and water in Richland
- 10 County, North Dakota, known as the "Lake Elsie Na-
- 11 tional Wildlife Refuge", as established by Executive Order
- 12 No. 8152, issued June 12, 1939, is terminated.
- 13 (b) EXECUTIVE ORDER.—Executive Order No. 8152,
- 14 issued June 12, 1939, is revoked.
- 15 SEC. 5. KLAMATH FOREST NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE.
- 16 Section 28 of the Act of August 13, 1954 (25 U.S.C.
- 17 564w-1), is amended in subsections (f) and (g) by striking
- 18 "Klamath Forest National Wildlife Refuge" each place it
- 19 appears and inserting "Klamath Marsh National Wildlife
- 20 Refuge".
- 21 SEC. 6. VIOLATION OF NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE SYS-
- 22 TEM ADMINISTRATION ACT.
- 23 Section 4 of the National Wildlife Refuge System Ad-
- 24 ministration Act of 1966 (16 U.S.C. 668dd) is amended—

1	(1) in the first sentence of subsection (c), by
2	striking "knowingly";
3	(2) in subsection (f)—
4	(A) by striking "(f) Any" and inserting the
5	following:
6	"(f) Penalties.—
7	"(1) Knowing violations.—Any";
8	(B) by inserting "knowingly" after "who";
9	and
10	(C) by adding at the end the following:
11	"(2) OTHER VIOLATIONS.—Any person who
12	otherwise violates or fails to comply with any of the
13	provisions of this Act (including a regulation issued
14	under this Act) shall be fined under title 18, United
15	States Code, or imprisoned not more than 180 days,
16	or both."; and
17	(3) in subsection (g)—
18	(A) by striking "(g) Any" and inserting
19	the following:
20	"(g) Enforcement.—
21	"(1) In general.—Any"; and
22	(B) by adding at the end the following:
23	"(2) Forfeiture.—A gun, trap, net, or other
24	equipment, or a vessel, vehicle, aircraft, or other
25	means of transportation, used to aid the commission

of a violation of this Act (including a regulation issued under this Act) shall be subject to forfeiture on conviction of a criminal violation under subsection (f)(1).

"(3) Other Laws.—

"(A) In General.—Except as provided in subparagraph (B), all provisions of law relating to the seizure, forfeiture, and condemnation of property for a violation of the customs laws of the United States, the disposition of the property and the proceeds of sale of the property, and the remission or mitigation of the forfeiture, shall apply to a seizure or forfeiture incurred, or alleged to have been incurred, under this Act to the extent that the provisions of law are applicable to, and not inconsistent with, this Act.

"(B) Officers or employees.—All powers, rights, and duties conferred or imposed by the customs laws of the United States on any officer or employee of the Department of the Treasury shall, for the purposes of this Act, be exercised or performed by the Secretary or such persons as the Secretary may designate.".
